My Regiment was organized by Col. G. B. Moore, President of College at Belton Texa, he was afterwards Brigadier Genl a graduate of West Point - in the fight at Shiloh 6th April 1862 - he rode around the head of the Regiment, took the flag and rode in front of the Regiment till our ^{men} ~~men~~ began to fire - we whipped the enemy & eat the breakfast they had just gotten ready for themselves (a good breakfast). we soon had another very hard fight probably about 9 o'clock - we then moved a little to the right and attacked a battery in front of Gunboats - we made 3 efforts to climb a slick hill - we then all moved slowly in a body - when got to the top of the hill - we all fired at once, we killed all the artillery men & took the battery - our Brigade captured Prentiss' Div - I was my Regiment was in Brigade with 3rd Tex Regiment. {Witness {William Montague Lucas Col of Hamilton 2nd Tex {J.
