

865: George Flinn discharge Kentucky Canals.

To all whom it may Concern:



Know ye, That

a Private of Captain George Quinn
Company, (C) Regiment of Kentucky Cavalry
VOLUNTEERS, who was enrolled on the Twelfth day of May
one thousand eight hundred and Sixty to serve Three years or
during the war, is hereby **Discharged** from the service of the United States
this Twelfth day of June, 1865, at Louisville
Kentucky by reason of him Order No 27 Sept 1863
(No objection to his being re-enlisted is known to exist.)*

Said George Quinn was born in Boon
in the State of Kentucky, is Eighteen years of age,
Six feet Six inches high, Fair complexion, Blue eyes,
Light hair, and by occupation, when enrolled, a Farmer

Given at Louisville by this Twelfth day of
June 1865.

*This sentence will be erased should there be anything
in the conduct or physical condition of the soldier
rendering him unfit for the Army.
