# McGwire of A's really hits it big

ven when Mark McGwire was convincing himself that he was a pitcher, he wasn't fooling anybody else.

McGwire, who as a rookie for the Oakland A's already has assaulted American League pitching for 21 home runs, is a natural-born hitter. He just didn't make hitting a top priority.

"I've always hit," says McGwire, clearly a leading Rookie of the Year candidate, "but I never took hitting seriously. It was just a part of the game. I was too busy thinking about pitching to get caught up in hitting."

While growing up in Pomona, Calif.,
McGwire dreamed of striking out major league
hitters with an improving fastball. And when
Marcel Lachemann lured him from Damien
High School to college baseball power Southern
Cal, McGwire figured the first major step had
been taken.

Now the pitching coach for the California Angels, Lachemann held the same position at Southern Cal when he first laid eyes on the big redhead.
