### THE HISTORY OF TORCH AND CASTLE

The Reserve Officers Training Corps, Corps of Engineers, was established at Texas Technological College in the fall of 1936. Captain F. A. Pettit and Lt. H. J. Skidmore were in charge of the organization.

The members of the unit held monthly social gatherings for a time and then an organization was formed. This organization was named the Torch and Castle. The name was derived from the lapel insignia of the uniform; namely: the Torch signifying the Reserve Officers Training Corp, and the Castle signifying Engineers. The mame was suggested by Amartus Chamberlain. The officers elected at that time were: Jack Carlson, president, Rufus Ryan, vice-president, Frank Montfort, secretary-treasurer.

The first annual Military Ball was held in that year. Miss Frances

Turner was honorary cadet major. A number of informal gatherings were held

that spring. "Random Bursts" made its first appearance during the fall.-This

being mimeographed publication which delued into the private lives of members.

To put it mildly Random Burst went the way of that well-loved (?) campus figure,

"Wind Through the Sallyport". There is left only a revival of one nature or

another at the annual Military Ball.

The following year, the first pledges were inducted into the organization at an overnight hike. This event has become a tradition of the club.

At the end of the year 1939-40, the club voted to affiliate itself with the national organization, Society of American Military Engineers. The organization is now know as the Torch and Castle Chapter of the national society.

Social events sponsored by the club are: Annual Military Ball, a benquet in the spring, and informal dance and an open house each semester.
