Discharged at Bowling Green, Ky. on account of sickness. Re-enlisted in Company G. 3rd Tenn. Reg. fall of 1862. Was captured at Jackson, Miss. 1863. (paroled) Went home and remained there until exchanged. (My command being where I could not reach it.) I joined Major Douglas' scouts and served with him till the winter of 1864. Was captured inside the Yankee line. paroled. Went home and did all I could inside the Yankee line for the cause of the Confederacy till the close of the war.

Was in the battle at Vicksburg against Grants force in January, 1863.

In the battle of Port Hudson against Farragut's fleet March 1863.

Battle at Raymond, Miss. May 1863.
