Yours of the 23rd was
recd today. I shall be greatly
gratified, for the sake of the men
who have gone into the Army &
their families, in this latter part
of the State & see the propositions
referred to by me passed. Nothing
can be done better for them. I
hope the friends of the measure &
the soldiers will be entering in
their exertions to get it through.

I was somewhat prepared from
a notice, (Mages however), after
perusing of your body, in the
papers, to hear that nothing truly
practical would be done in
regard to organizing among
the militia. I see both houses have
passed Judge Hendersons project
to call out the home guard. What
a supremely damned farce this is.
Worse than absurd work. I do
see that the legislators should

by this time, know the hand guard
has nothing of vitality in
it. It cannot enforce itself
This call on the hand guard
will amount to nothing, but
a deception on the people.
Half of them must come out
& there is nothing to force them
They are not armed & clothed
They are not exercised, they do
nothing in the place, But unless
we have an organized militia,
look for bloodshed, crime &
misery in a high degree.

The best project I have
seen from the Legislature, if they
want to organize the militia
is the project of enrolling
a hundred men to each
Rep., equipping & arming them
