Gentlemen: -- We enclose revised price lists showing an advance of one cent per pound in the price of STAR, taking effect October 1st, 1889.

On every purchase of STAR made from us on and after October 1st, 1889, and until further notice, we will credit jobbers four cents per pound, and on urchases of our other brands, three cents per pound as heretofore. At the ind of every sixty days from September 1st will settle for such credits by sending our check for amount of same to those customers whose bills have been paid by cash; and by deducting the amount from first bill bought after the settlement day by those patrons whose purchases were settled for by notes or acceptances, or will send them our check for the amount of their credit when their notes or acceptances have been paid.

We expressly reserve the right to decline any further orders from patrons who directly or indirectly sell our tobacco below the prices at which we invoice the same to them, or sell same on longer time than sixty days, or allow a greater discount than two per cent for cash, or make any other allowance on same, whether by prepaying freight or otherwise, or whose salesmen, employes or agents make such sales or allowances.
