"Whereas by a Grand Assembly held the 17th of Feb. 1644. It was then enacted by the consent of Mr. Tho: Hampton rector of Ja: City parish, That the inhabitants of the east side of Archers hope creeke to the head thereof, and downe to Warehams poods, should be a distinct parish of themselves. But it was further enacted by the authority of this present Grand Assembly That the said parish be nominated and called by the name of Harrop parish.

Mrs. Sarah Buchanan Hampton was born in Montgomery Co. Ky Nov 6, 1807, died after a short & painful illness of Typhoid - Pneumonia at Hampton City, Bay D. Co., Ky. Apr. 20, 1874

Her father, Wm Buchanan moved in 1811 from Montgomery Co into what was then Greenup Co., now Lawrence Co., and settled upon the banks of Big Sandy 16 miles from mouth. "The country then was but little removed from an Indian wild. Hence he became prominently identified with the early history of the county in its various interests and developments; but more especially with its religious history. His house was made to serve the triple purpose of dwelling, preaching place, throne for the pioneer preachers of the gospel."
