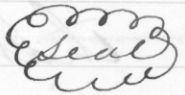

1874: Land deed, Harriet Mackie (?) to
James H. Miller

This deed made this 28th day of April 1874 between Harriet Machis of the County of Mason and State of West Virginia of the first part and James H Miller of the same County and state of the second part, witnesseth that for and in Consideration of the sum of six hundred dollars good and lawful money by the said party of the second part paid to the said party of the first part, the receipt whereof is thereby acknowledged, she the said Harriet Machis does hereby grant bargain and sell unto the said James H Miller the following described tract of land situated in the district of Arbuckle in the County of Mason aforesaid, and bounded and described as follows, Beginning at a stone in the military line, same a corner to land belonging to Wm A Long, thence leaving Longs land and with military line N 70° W 154 poles & 5 links to a fallen white oak on North East side of a drain, original military corner, thence N 30° W 51 poles to a stone same a corner to land now owned by J L Newman thence leaving military line and with said Newmans line S 30° 45' W 111 poles to a stone pile on east side hill, thence S 70° E 194 poles & 17 links to a small leaning black oak in Old Yankee purchased line, now line of W A Long aforesaid, and thence with said line N 36° 45' E 76 poles to the place of beginning containing ninety nine acres, To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land unto the said James H Miller his heirs and assigns forever, and the said

Harriet Machin does hereby covenant to
and with the said James B. Miller, that
she will warrant generally the promises hereby
conveyed or so intended to be as witness the
following signature and seal,
