

Harrison Jan 25th 1894

Dear Cousin

I arrived home safe but it rained very hard and I got not a little wet I was in hopes there would have been sleighing before this I was rejoiced when it began to snow on Thursday but it could not snow without raining to take it all away I hope your company all come and I suppose if they did you enjoyed yourself but above all I hope Cyrus was there when I got home every body wanted to know if David was married when I told them no they would not believe it on Monday evening Aunt Eliza had some company and Thomas went around inviting to the wedding party he asked Batharine and Isobel but did not invite little Isobel nor me but little Isobel went she wore her striped silk and Kate wore her pearl colour silk but when they got there the bride was not there when they went ~~out~~ to tea Aunt Eliza said it was just 25 years since she was married, Bill is as attentive as ever to Isobel Abiaks cloak was safe and she has not got it made yet I saw Mr Purdy today and had a very polite bow from him Oh how I wish I was to your house again to drink lemonade and make taffy tell Marg when she and Francis agree to step off she must let me know I cannot bear any more to write give my love to Sarah Cornille and tell Henry the next time I eat Philadelphia with him he will pay up remember me to your Grandma and your Father and tell him he must certainly come up soon excuse the half sheet of paper you must not try too hard for that bunch of flowers that George promised us
