<sup>1</sup>The Bektaşî is a member of the Bektaşî order of Dervishes, one of the most powerful of religious orders in Turkey before the founding of the Republic. It was not always in accord with orthodox Islam on religious matters; it was often involved in political issues. It had its own brand of mysticism. Its members often broke basic Moslem laws, drank alcohol freely, and were (at least in the folktale tradition) openly profane and sacrilegious.
