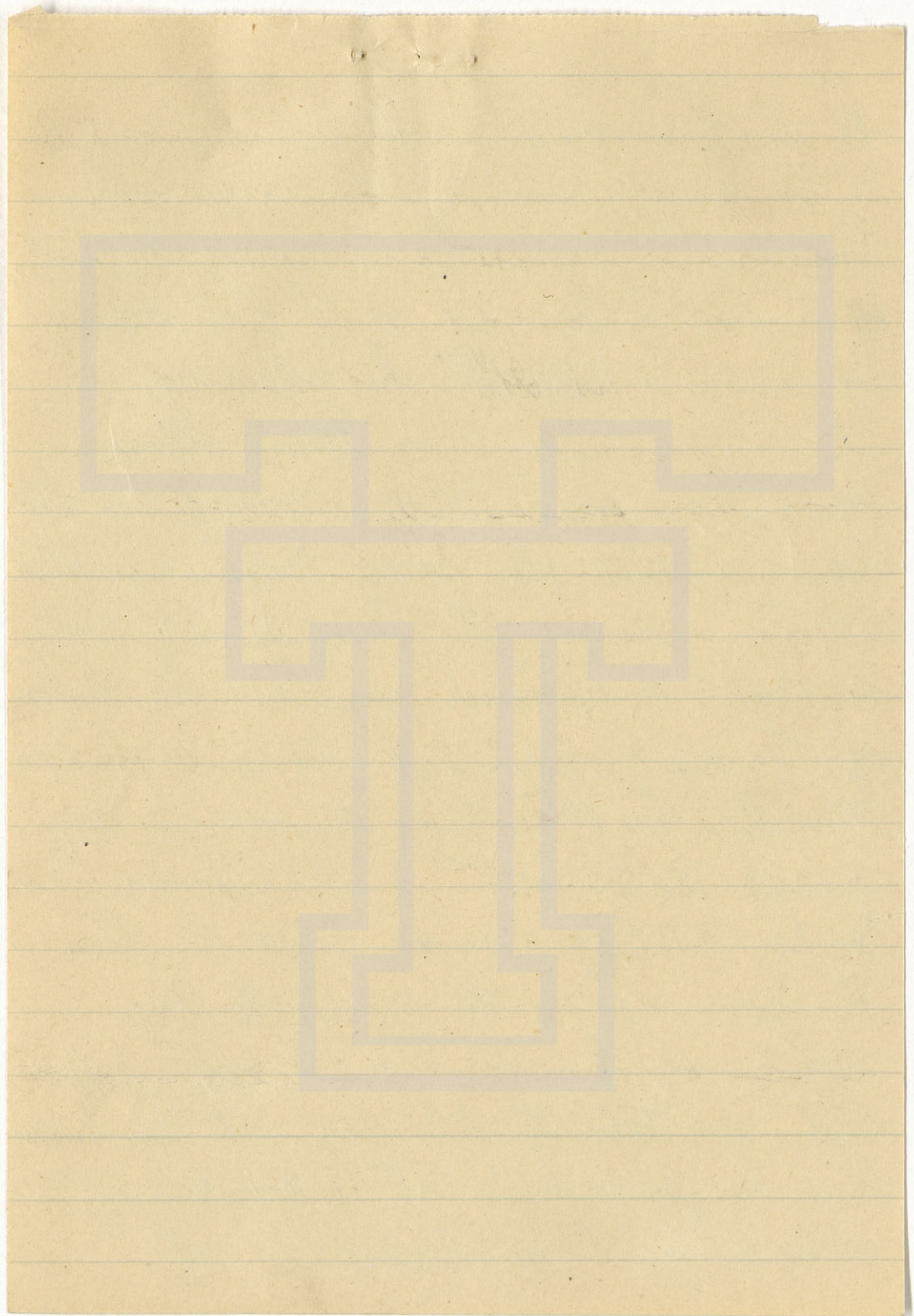


To the Commander and members of R

The Son is in the army to day.

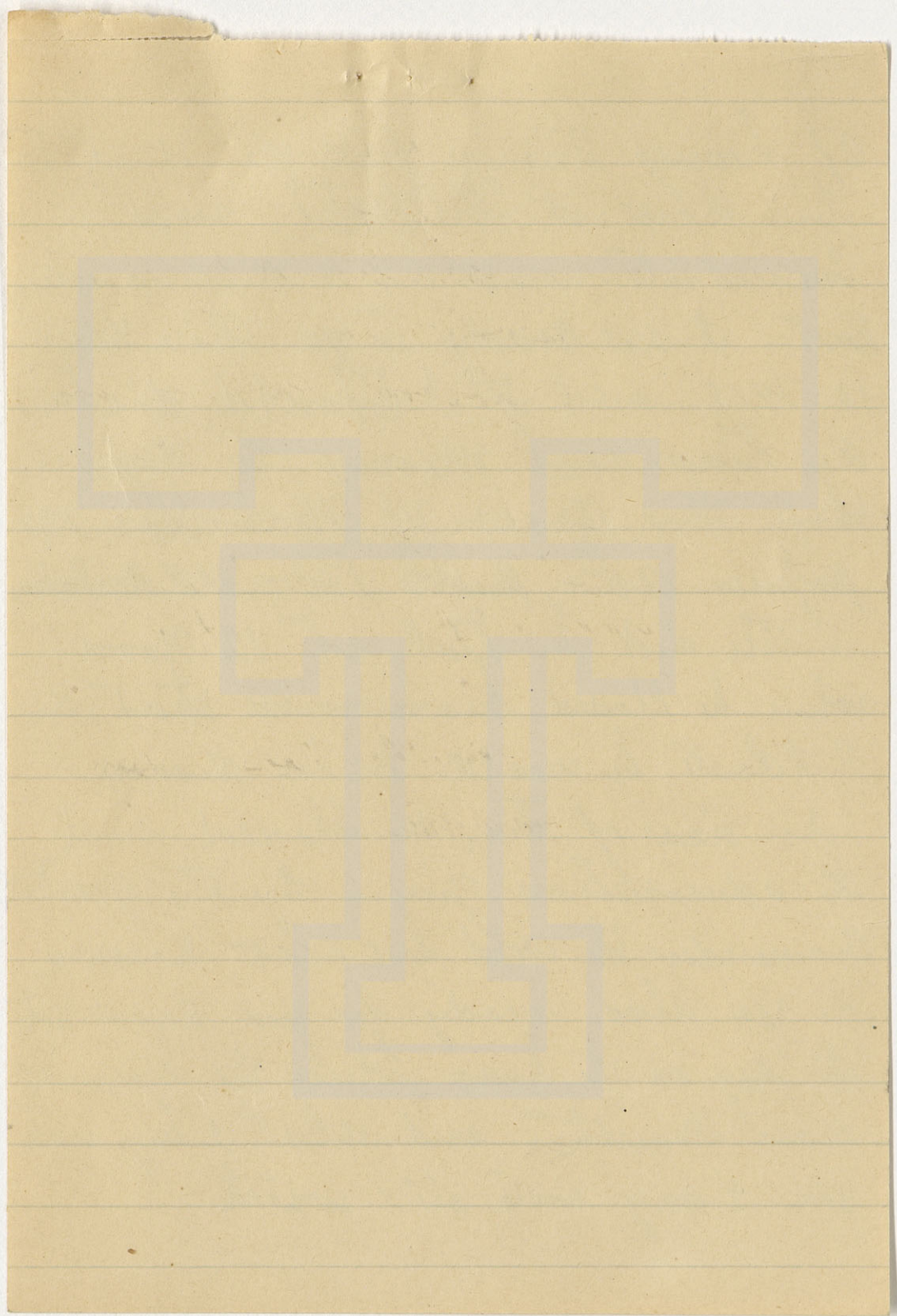
We Learn from his Church paper
