Letter on Associate Members
from Mrs Cornelia Branch Stone
President General U. D. C.

Galveston Texas
February 8th 1908.

My dear Mrs Northrup.

The reply to your letter has been unavoidably delayed by the severe illness of my sister and brother-in-law, who has been in bed for two weeks past with grippe and my mail, at the rate of at least twenty five letters a day, has been neglected.

The "Honorary Associate Membership" was instituted by the Gen'l Convention, U. D. C., to honor Gen'l Inauss of Ohio who, through a Northern, and a member of the I. O. O. F., had risked the Confederate dead around and in Columbus, Ohio - and had erected, at his own cost, a monument to these Confederate Soldiers - and this honor will be used very sparingly or it will cease to be an honor.

It was not intended to apply to Chapter or State Divisions.

There is no Constitutional provision, or rather prohibition, that will prevent Chapters from having "Associate Members" but in the South, where there is so much eligible material for membership in the U. D. C., this neither seems desirable or advisable. So, you will see, that that By-Law

does not apply to the Chapter, it was adopted for the express purpose of honoring Col. Inauss, and it is not extended in its operations to Chapters or Divisions, but is to govern the Gen'l. U. D. C.

It should be a very extraordinary service, that should be so honored. It means nothing, except a title in that case. Confers no privilege, but in order to do it we had to make that By-Law - and I presented it, at the U. D. C. Convention which met in St. Louis, Cal.

Inauss' work has never been done by any one else - and he stands alone, as our "Honorary Associate Member".

Will be glad to hear of the work of the Barnard C. D. U. Chapter - a Chapter which has always been active in good work.
