## APPLICATION FOR STANDARD GOVERNMENT HEADSTONE OR MARKER FOR INSTALLATION IN A PRIVATE OR STATE VETERANS' CEMETERY

**RESPONDENT BURDEN** - Public reporting burden for this collection of information is estimated to average one-fourth hour per response, including the time for reviewing instructions, searching existing data sources, gathering and maintaining the data needed, and completing and reviewing the collection of information. Send comments regarding this burden estimate or any other aspect of this collection of information, including suggestions for reducing this burden to VA Clearance Officer (723), 810 Vermont Avenue, NW, Washington, DC 20420; and to the Office of Management and Budget, Paperwork Reduction Project (2900-0222), Washington, DC 20503.

### BENEFIT PROVIDED

**a. HEADSTONE OR MARKER** - Furnished upon application for the **unmarked grave** of any deceased veteran. Applicant must certify the grave is **unmarked** and a Government headstone or marker is preferred to a privately purchased headstone or marker. This restriction applies to companion markers. Companion markers identify two or more decedents buried, or to be buried, in the same or adjoining graves. A grave is considered marked if a monument displays the decedent's name and dates of birth and/or death, even though the veteran's military data is not shown. Applicant may be anyone having knowledge of the deceased.

**b. MEMORIAL HEADSTONE OR MARKER** - Furnished upon application by a relative recognized as the next of kin for installation only in a cemetery to commemorate any veteran whose remains have not been recovered or identified, were buried at sea, donated to science, or cremated and the remains scattered. Check box in block 2 and explain in block 27.

**c. BRONZE NICHE MARKER** - See illustration for standard bronze niche marker if entombment is in a columbarium or mausoleum; if desired, so indicate in block 27.

**WHO IS ELIGIBLE** - Any deceased veteran discharged under conditions other than dishonorable. To expedite processing, attach a copy of the deceased veteran's discharge certificate or a copy of other official document(s) pertaining to military service, if available. **Do not send original documents**; they will not be returned. Service after September 7, 1980, must be for a minimum of 24 months or be completed under special circumstances, e.g., death on active duty. Persons who have only limited active duty service for training while in the National Guard or Reserves are not eligible unless there are special circumstances, e.g., death while on, or as a result of training. Persons with extended Reserve or National Guard service which entitled them to retirement pay subsequent to October 27, 1992, are eligible; a copy of the Reserve Retirement Eligibility Benefits Letter must accompany the application. Active duty service during the Persian Gulf War for all referenced above also establishes eligibility. Service prior to World War I requires detailed documentation, e.g., muster rolls, extracts from State files, military or State organization where served, pension or land warrant, etc.

**SIGNATURES REQUIRED** - The applicant, next of kin or other responsible person, signs in block 15, obtains the signature of consignee in block 22 and cemetery official in block 24. If there is no official on duty at the cemetery write "NONE" in block 24. State Veterans' Cemeteries are not required to complete blocks: 15, 16, 22 and 23.

**ASSISTANCE NEEDED** - If assistance is needed to complete this application, contact the nearest VA Regional Office, national cemetery, or a local veterans' organization. No fee should be paid in connection with the preparation of this application. Use block 27 for any clarification or information you wish to provide. Should you have special questions when filling out this form, please telephone our Applicant Assistance Division toll free at: 1-800-697-6947.

**INSTALLATION** - All costs to install the headstone or marker must be paid from private funds.

**TRANSPORTATION** - The headstone or marker is shipped without charge to the consignee, designated in block 19 of the application. The consignee must have a full street address; **delivery cannot be made to a Post Office Box**. An address showing Rural Route Delivery must include a telephone number in block 20 to obtain delivery. An insufficient address may result in a nondeliverable headstone or marker.

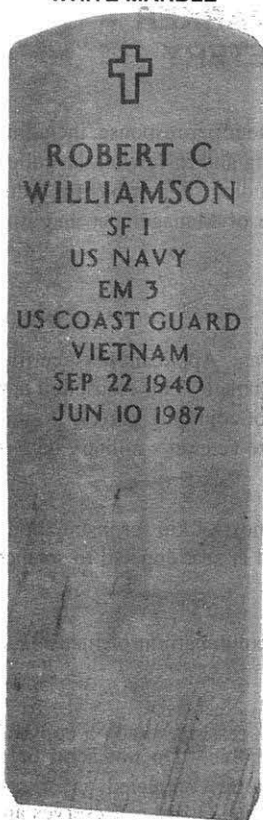
**CAUTION** - After completing the application, **please check carefully** to be sure you have accurately furnished all required information, thereby avoiding delays in marking the gravesite. Mistakes cannot be corrected after a headstone or marker has been ordered. 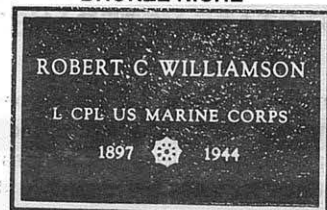

This headstone is 42 inches long, 13 inches wide, and 4 inches thick. Weight is approximately 230 pounds. Variations may occur in stone color, and the marble may contain light to moderate veining.

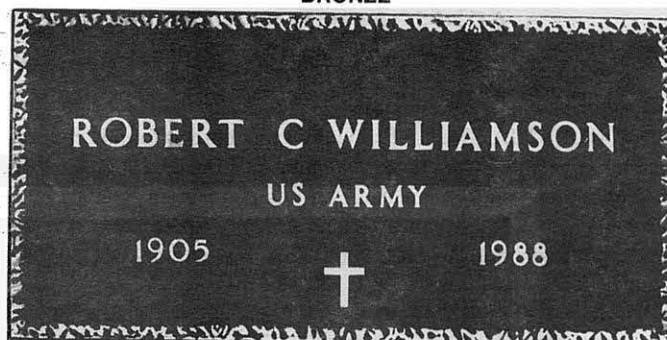
BRONZE NICHE



This niche marker is 8-1/2 inches long, 5-1/2 inches wide, with 7/16 inches rise. Weight is approximately 3 pounds; mounting bolts and washers are furnished with the marker.

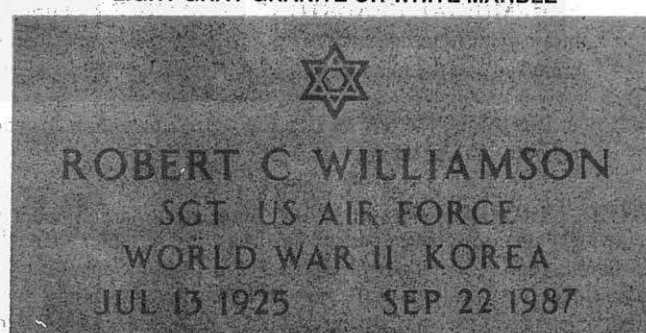
FLAT TYPES

BRONZE



This grave marker is 24 inches long, 12 inches wide, with 3/4 inch rise. Weight is approximately 18 pounds. Anchor bolts, nuts and washers for fastening to a base are furnished with the marker. The base is not furnished by the Government.

LIGHT GRAY GRANITE OR WHITE MARBLE



This grave marker is 24 inches long, 12 inches wide, and 4 inches thick. Weight is approximately 130 pounds. Variations may occur in stone color; the marble may contain light to moderate veining.

**NOTE:** In addition to the headstone and markers pictured, two special styles of upright marble headstones and flat markers are available upon request - one for those who served with the Union Forces, Civil War, or during the Spanish-American War; and the other for those who served with the Confederate Forces, Civil War. Request should be made in block 27 of the application. It is necessary to submit detailed documentation which supports eligibility.

## INSCRIPTION INFORMATION

**MANDATORY ITEMS** of inscription at Government expense are: Name, Branch of Service, Year of Birth, and Year of Death. Branches of Service are: U.S. Army, U.S. Navy, U.S. Air Force, U.S. Marine Corps, U.S. Coast Guard, and by exception, U.S. Army Air Corps, and other parent organizations authorized for certain periods of time. Different examples of inscription formats are illustrated above; **deviations in data sequence are not permitted.** More than one branch of service is permitted, subject to space availability.



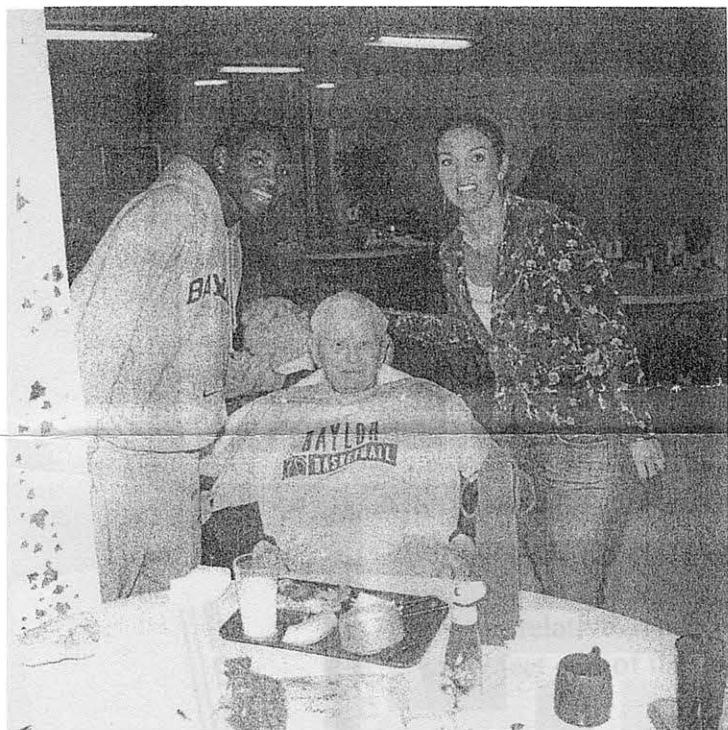

Last week I attended the visitation and graveside service for my cousin's wife, Margaret Louise (Mrs. Thomas Francis) Northen. She is buried in the Thornhill/Northen plot in the Holland City Cemetery.

While I was chatting with her son Homer Ray, next to the tall monument of James H. Thornhill (Nov. 7, 1833 – Jun. 29, 1917), Homer told me that Mr. Thornhill was a Confederate veteran. He thinks that he served in Virginia, but he died in the Holland area. Mr. Thornhill was not a relative of mine but ancestor to several of my cousins. His monument is only a few feet east of the permanent shelter in the cemetery, in a large curbed plot.

I have ordered a headstone for Solomon Alexander Dunn's daughter and son-in-law, who are buried at the foot of Solomon's grave. It should be installed in January. I have obituaries for all eight people I know to be buried in that plot.

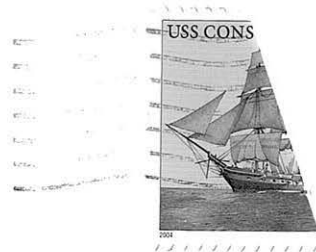



I know you have a copy of Solomon Dunn's Texas Confederate Pension Application. I have a copy of it as well as a copy of James H. Thornhill's (Approved 27662). I'd have to pull my copy for any more information than what follows. I'm at work now with just a copy of my notes on my computer. They show he served for 3 years as a private in the Virginia 4th Cavalry, Company C, serving under Captain Strother and Colonel William Wickham. (As a note: All 9 of his sons were named after Confederate generals. The only death information I have on any of them is Charles Ashby Thornhill (1868 - 1930) buried in Holland -- I assume the cemetery, but my notes here may be incomplete.)

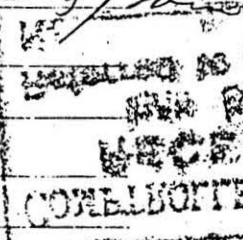

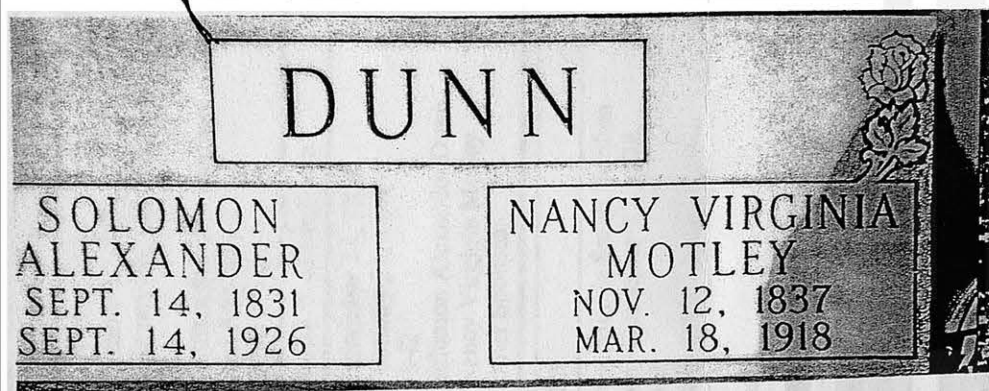



THIRD ALABAMA CAVALRY

The Third Alabama Cavalry was organized at Tupelo, Mississippi, during late June, 1862. A number of companies of the regiment had seen prior service as independent cavalry companies. More detailed information has been found on five of the regiment's companies. This material appears below.

Soon after being mustered into Confederate service the regiment was moved to Chattanooga, Tennessee, and, from there, to Sparta, Tennessee. There it joined the Army of the Mississippi. The name of that Army was subsequently changed to the Army of Tennessee. The Third Alabama Cavalry served in that Army until late 1863. It then joined the Department of East Tennessee. In the following spring the unit rejoined the Army of Tennessee. In early 1865 it was reported in the Department of South Carolina, Georgia, and Florida but it returned to the Army of Tennessee in the early spring. It served in that Army for the rest of its career. Listed below are the specific higher command assignments of the unit.

Kansas City, Sept. 15.—An explosion early today in a water tunnel being constructed under the Missouri river here is believed to have resulted in the deaths of eight workmen who were in the tunnel.

Officials in charge of the work said no bodies had been recovered and they feared all the men lost their lives.

Charles S. Foreman, engineer in charge of the construction, penetrated a thousand feet back from the mouth of the tunnel, through debris and smoke, and reported that he could hear no sounds from the point of the explosion.

The crew of eight men went to work at 11 o'clock last night. They had two cases of dynamite, both of which are believed to have exploded.

The tunnel is a unit of Kansas City new water system.

The men in the tunnel were: Byron Taylor, foreman; H. Laster and Frank Garrison, drillers, and W. Light, Pat Joyce, W. F. Bailey, J. Hanes and William Cola, laborers.

Although the explosion occurred at 8:45 a. m. the police and hospitals were not notified until about 2:30 o'clock.

Emergency crews to attempt rescue work were formed immediately.

The tunnel is being constructed 270 feet below the surface of the ground. Neither the force nor sound of the concussion were noticeable at the tunnel entrance.

S. A. Dunn, pioneer Bell county resident, died Tuesday evening at 8:20 o'clock at the close of his ninety-fifth birthday at the home of his daughter, Mrs. J. B. Stewart at Troy.

He had been ill about four weeks but up to the time of his illness had been very active. Mr. Dunn came to Texas from Daviston, Ala., in 1877 and settled in the southern part of Bell county near Holland and for 49 years had been a resident of this county, always active in the affairs of the community in which he lived and always a beloved neighbor and citizen. He joined the Baptist church as a boy and was a devout Christian all of his life. In the war between the states, he enlisted with the Confederate forces and was put to work making shoes for the army as he was an expert bench shoe man.

Surviving him are seven children, all of whom were present at the time of his death. His wife, Mrs. Nancy Virginia Matley Dunn, to whom he was married 73 years ago, died eight years ago in Holland and he will be laid to rest by her side in the Holland cemetery. Surviving him are five generations including 108 children, grandchildren, great grandchildren and great-great-grandchildren.

His immediate children are: Mrs. John Dunn of Floydada, J. A. Dunn of Fort Worth, L. Y. Dunn of Houston, Mrs. G. W. Northern of Holland, Mrs. B. D. Garmany of Temple, Mrs. J. C. Hughes of Holland and Mrs. J. B. Stewart of Troy.

Funeral services were held at the home of his daughter, Mrs. J. B. Stewart, in Troy at 2:30 o'clock Wednesday afternoon, conducted by Rev. W. W. Rivers, pastor of Memorial Baptist church of Temple, and burial was in the Holland cemetery at 4 p. m.
