

J. M. Sypert Buried At Sunshine Sunday

J. M. Sypert, 88, pioneer Bell County resident, died at his home in Oklahoma City Friday night after an illness of three months.

Mr. Sypert was among the best known of the early settlers here. He was born in Tennessee Dec. 3, 1843, and came to Texas in 1949 with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. William Carroll Sypert. He was educated in Nacogdoches county and at the age of 18, in the spring of 1852, enlisted in Company D, Carter's regiment, Parsons' brigade, Confederate army.

He served in the Arkansas campaign, was with General Marmaduke in Missouri and fought in the battle of Yellow Bayou in Louisiana.

In 1868 Mr. Sypert was married to Miss Virginia Reed, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William Reed. To them four children were born, two of whom survive.

Mr. Sypert is survived by his wife, two children—Mrs. Permelia Brantley, of Oklahoma City, and Mrs. Lee Clark of Plainview, three sisters—Mrs. Mary A. Sharp of Davilla, Mrs. Sallie Shurtleff of Rogers and Mrs. Glass Sharp of Phoenix.

He has many nieces and nephews in Bell County.

The body arrived in Holland over the Katy Sunday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock. It was taken directly to the Reed cemetery at Old Sunshine for burial.

Funeral services were held at 2 p. m. at Sunshine.
