S.D. King private in Co. A. 9th Texas Cavalry was born in Ray Co. Mo. April 25th, 1844. and enlisted in March 1861 in Tarrant Co. Texas. He was in all of the battles in which the regiment was engaged except one with the Indians until captured near West Point, Miss. March the 8th 1864. and was in prison at Camp Chase, Ohio, until Feby. 27th 1865, was then paroled with five hundred others at Aiken Landing on the James River twelve miles from Richmond, Va.

Therefore be it resolved that the camp has lost a true and loyal member the community in which he lived an upright christian gentleman, His surviving wife and daughter a loving husband and father. Resolved futher that a copy of these resolutions be furnished the family. Respectfully submitted by the committee.

one with the Indians until captured near Fort Smith, Ark. March 1864,
1864, and was in prison at Camp Chase, Ohio, until May 1864, when
then paroled with five hundred others as Union soldiers on the Texas
River twelve miles from Richmond, Va.

and loyal member the community in which he lived an upright Christian
gentleman, his surviving wife and daughter a loving husband and father.
