He was the senior member of the law firm of Brown & Marton ranking among the leading lawvers of the state, and enjoyed a very extensive and lucrative practice. December 11, 1878, he married Miss Mary Lackey, daughter of the late Greenville Lackey, and to this union three children were born, all of whom to gether with Mrs. Brown, are living, as follows: Alexander Lackey Brown, Mrs. Quinn Poage, wife of Robert Poage, of Ashland, and Miss Florence Brown. Mr. Brown joined the Presbyterian church in 1872, since which time he has lived a consistent Christian life, and for a long time has been a veritable pillar in the First Presbyterian church of this city.
