The Kroeker family was proud of its German heritage, so when Peter died, his family buried him on his own farmland. When Peter's daughter-in-law, Mrs. Henry Kroeker, died, she was buried in the family plot. Later two infants were interred in the little cemetery. When the family moved, the plot was enclosed with a fence. A direct descendant provided the information.
