I have been trying to get up courage to write to Vernon, Ben, and Elmo but there is so much confusion in the house. I cannot think sensibly.

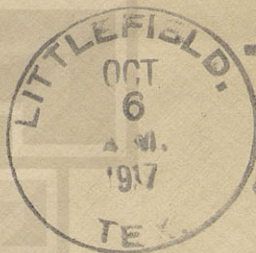
Tom wrote if he did not have to go to Chicago the last of this week, they would come over Sunday.
