Tech Owns Portion Of PanTech Farms

A portion of PanTech Farms, Panhandle, Tex., will become the property of Texas Tech as the result of action June 29 of the Tech board of directors.

Tech is to get a quick-claim (non-restricted) deed to 6.000 acres of choice Panhandle farm land in the PanTex Ordnance area at the cost of little more than a fancy side-step.

In 1947, the United States government turned over the 17.000acre tract to Tech for agricultural experimental purposes. Provisions in the contract—which had a recall clause-stated that the property would belong to Tech after 20 years. After the turn of the half-century, however, a multimillion dollar Atomic Energy plant was constructed on a portion of the land; and, legally, would have belonged to Tech in 16 years.

Under Secretary of the Army Earl D. Johnson described the government land-giving as one of To salvage the atomic energy plant and land surrounding the plant for the government, the Department of the Army made Tech from members of Tech's boardthat for a quick-claim deed to the government's recalled land, the government would give Tech a similar deed to its farm acreage. The board approved this proposal June 29.

So, just by a cat's whisker, Tech would have been the only institution of higher learning with its own plant for making atom bombs.

More Box Seats In Jones Stadium **Opened To Public**

Box seats between the 42-yard lines to all Texas Tech and Lubbock High School football games for the next five seasons are being made available.

Section O, on the East side, has been opened to the public and is being equipped with folding, theater-type seats in boxes of eight, six, and four. To pay for the installation of

the seats and to obtain the option for five years, box purchasers are being asked for \$150 in addition to the charge for season tickets. Options on six-seat boxes cost \$112.50; four-seat boxes, \$75. There are only a limited number of six- and four-seat boxes.



The \$2,000 Hiram Parks Scholarship at Texas Tech for 1953-54 has been awarded to Maria Ramos, 20, of Shallowater.


The scholarship was set up in 1945 by Mr. and Mrs. Hiram Parks of Lubbock to encourage young people of Latin-American descent their continue education through college.



A native Texan, who attained his education the hard way by "slinging hash" and serving as a waiter, is the new vice president of Tech. Dr. G. E. Giesecke will be vice president in charge of aca-demic administration. He is a native of Marble Falls, Tex.

Absence Changes Put Responsibility On Each Student

Responsibility for class attend-ance this year will be placed on the shoulders of the individual students, says Dr. E. N. Jones. The revised absence regulations, effective Sept. 19, divide students into two classes—those doing sat-isfactory work and those who are not.

The student doing satisfactory work is responsible for his own class attendance until his absences add up to two weeks of classes or until he misses a week of classes consecutively. Then a notice will be sent to the dean of his division.

The instructor reports the student doing unsatisfactory work when the total number of ab-sences in the course, consecutive or otherwise, equals one week of classes, or when the total number of absences becomes sufficient to jeopardize his standing in the course. It is up to the instructor to decide when this point has been reached.

The new regulations discontinue negative hours, double cuts, and make-up cards.

"Records of Eligibility for Out-of-Town Trip" slips will continue to be used. Also, clinic, infirmary, and dormitory illness slips will continue to be used. Although there is no such thing as an "ex-cused absence," these slips will help the instructor decide whether help the instructor decide whether he will permit work to be made up. The student is responsible for all work of the course, whether present or not.

Dr. Giesecke, whose major was foreign languages, with emphasis on German, has had many inter-esting experiences abroad. In 1931-32, during the beginning of the Nazi regime, he studied at the Un-iversity of Marburg, Germany, on a fellowship awarded by the Ins-titute of International Education. He was again in Europe in 1945 He was again in Europe in 1945, in time to see Germany fall. At this time, Dr. Giesecke was a member of the U.S. Naval Technical Mission, which interrogated enemy scientists and technicians. He later received a commendation for this duty.

Louise, Dr. Giesecke's wife, was also in Germany during World War II. Mrs. Giesecke went to Europe to study on a fellowship granted by the Institution of In-ternational Education, but on the onset of the war, joined the American Foreign Service. She was overseas from 1939 to 1941, and was evacuated along with other Americans in Germany.

Dr. Giesecke's duties as vicepresident include supervision of faculty and student work. He will also serve as chairman of the Council of Deans.

The new vice-president has three degrees, A,B., M.A. and Ph.D., from Leland Stanford Universi-

ty at Palo Alto, Calif. Dr. Giesecke taught German at Stanford and at the University of Illinois. At Illinois U. he was a counselor in the Student Personnel Bureau.

After serving in the Navy four years, Dr. Giesecke returned to Illinois U., where he established the first counseling program in the residence halls divisions, serv-ed as assistant dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences. Later he was assistant dean of the Galesburg Undergraduate Division.

Before coming to Tech. Dr. Giesecke was Dean of the College of Applied Arts and Sciences at North Dakota Agricultural College, where he founded, and was made executive secretary of, the North Dakota Institute of Regional Studies. This institution col-lects and preserves material re-lating to the resources and cultures of North Dakota and the Northern

Great Plains area. Dr. and Mrs Giesecke have two children, Mark, 5, and Helene, 6 weeks old.

Evening Courses Have 61 **Enrolled From Reese AFB**

Sixty-one military personnel from Reese Air Force Base have registered for evening courses at Tech, the Reese education office reports.

All Reese personnel and their dependents who have completed two years of college work or passed the college General Educational Development test are eligible to participate in "Operation Bootstrap," a program under which the Air Force pays three-fourths of the tuition.


The organization of the Ex-Students' Association of Tech consists of the Association Council, the Executive Board, Athletic Council Representative, and local chapters. The governing body of the Association is the Association Council. Its membership includes one representative from each of the Association Districts, together with an ex-officio membership of each local chapter President, members of the Executive Board, and the elected officers of each senior class and the president of the junior class. There are 29 As-sociation Districts in Texas and seven Districts over the rest of the U. S.

The Council has a double re-sponsibility. Besides being the governing body, it is responsible for the management, policies and program of the Association. It is the representative of the Association among the clubs, districts, and groups from which its mem-bers are drawn. The Council en-deavors to assist the College and the Association in every possible manner and through its members secure the interest and co-operation of other members of the Association and friends of the College.

Nine members are elected to the Executive Board by the Council at its annual meeting. The President, vice presidents, im-mediate past President, Repre-sentative to the Athletic Council, and the Executive Secretary of the Association are members of the Beard The meniping these mem Board. The remaining three members, or directors, are elected to serve for three years-one elected each year to provide overlapping The Board carries on the terms. affairs of the Council between meetings, makes and presents to the Council an annual report and a budget of estimated revenue and expense, and directs and super-vises the detailed features of the Association and its program.

The Executive Secretary-Treasurer performs such duties as the Executive Board may determine. He is the executive officer of the Association, attends all meetings of the Board and Council, and keeps all records and proceedings thereof. Under the direction of the Association, he conducts the correspondence, is responsible for the property of the Association, keeps a mailing list of former students and graduates, is in charge of all departments of the Association, co-operates with the College, and in a general way carries out such duties as may be assigned to him by the Executive Board. He is responsible for the receipt, dis-bursement, and proper acknow-ledgement of all moneys or other contributions and for the adequate accounting of the same.

The purpose of the Association are many and varied. Some of these are: to maintain the interest of the former student in Tech and Ex-Students' activities; to acquire a better understanding of the College's aims and ideals; to

have accepted invitations to colonize on the campus this fall. Dean of Women Marjorie Neely said

recently that she is correspond-ing with national officiers of the organizations, hoping that initial steps can take place the latter part of the semester.

Alpha Chi Omega is comprised of 76 active chapters and 107 alumnae clubs. Founded at De-Pauw University, Greencastle, Ind., it was one of ten soror-ities which founded the National Panhellenic Association. Its char-ity work has included care for 157 French war orphans after World War I, aid to British child-ren in World War II, and at present, aid to children afflicted with cerebral palsy. Contributions

with cerebral palsy. Contributions to fine arts scholarships are made annually. Only one other chapter exists in the state at present, at the University of Texas.

Delta Gamma has 77 active chapters and 200 alumnae clubs. It was founded at Lewis School in Oxford, Miss. As a national philanthropy, it devotes aid to sight conservation and to the blind. The Nursery School for the Visually Handicapped is main-tained at Los Angeles, Calif. Scholarships are provided for training of specialists to work with the blind.

The other member of Dean Neely's staff is Mrs. Edna Eikel, resident hostess of Horn Hail who joined the Texas Tech family in



Fulbright Grant to Benefit Seniors, Grad Students

Seniors and beginning grad-uate students at Texas Tech have until Oct. 31 to apply for foreign study grants under the Fulbright Act and the Buenos Aires Convention for 1954-55.

Dr. G. E. Giesecke, academic vice president and campus Fulbright representative, announced the opening of study opportunities abroad .Details concerning grants and applications can be obtained at his office.

In general, the Fulbright Act will cover transportation, ex-penses of a language refresher or orientation course abroad, tuition, books, and maintenance for one academic year. The allowance is based on living costs in the coun-try in which the award is tenable-and in the currency of the country. Transportation and maintenance of dependents are the responsibility of the grantee. Before making application, applicants are expected to have a study plan which can be carried out profitably in a year.

Selection of students for grants programs on the applicant's personal qualifications, academic record, value of proposed study or research, and suitability for placement in an institution of higher learning abroad. Sweden has withdrawn from the program for 1954-55.

"The college wishes to encourage its graduating seniors, grad-uates, and faculty to investigate such study grants," Dr. Giesecke said.

"We feel that such experiences will broaden the individual, making him a better teacher and giving him a better understanding of world problems.'

Texas Tech opened its doors for the 29th consecutive year Sept. 17 with several changes in curriculum, administration, its and faculty.

A major change in engineering offerings went into effect with the new term. A new five- year plan is designed to give the graduate engineer a broad background in the social, natural, and political sciences. The five-year plan has been worked out with Baylor University and Hardin-Simmons University so that student engineers can take the three years of liberal arts work at one of the three schools—including Tech—prior to coming to Tech for the two years and a summer of engineering.

New in the administration for the 1953-54 school year are Dr. G. E. Giesecke, vice president in charge of academic life; Dr. Willa Vaughn Tinsley, dean of home economics; and Lewis Jones, dean of men.

Several departments have new administrative heads. Dr. John Dowling will take over the department of foreign languages upon the partial retirement of Dr. C. Qualia. Nolan E. Barrick В. comes to Tech as head of the department of architecture and allied arts to take over the administrative duties of Prof. E. A. Kleinschmidt.

On the non-teaching staff will be a former FBI agent and assistant district attorney for Dallas County, E. W. (Bud) Smith. He will head the department of development of the Texas Tech Foundation, which is a new office devoted to the promotion of special-activity financing for the college.

Tech started the fall term with about 306 individuals who will teach one or more subjects. The number, including eight of the original, is a far cry from the 35 faculty members whe were at Tech when the college opened in 1925.
