Pledge to Student Union Falls Short

The Ex-Students Association's project for 1952 was a pledge of \$25,000.00 towards the new Student Union Building at Tech. This, the biggest project yet undertaken by Tech's organized ex-students, was almost realized in 1952.

Enough money was raised during the year to enable the executive secretary to write a check for \$17,500 towards this pledge. Although the response was excellent in the drives, the Ex-Students must still raise \$7,500 before the pledge can be fulfilled.

Therefore, the raising of this sum will be the Association's primary project during 1953. As a secondary project, the Association plans to establish a loan fund for needy students.

Class of '52 Leads

The class of 1952 contributed more than any other class to the Association's project last year, giving \$4,591.50. Last year's leader, the class of '49, came in second with \$4,520.46. Third place went to the class of '51, which contributed \$4,283.26. Other top places went to the classes of '50, '41, '32, and '33. Those persons who did not designate their classes also made a good showing.

Tech Owns Portion Of PanTech Farms

A portion of PanTech Farms, Panhandle, Tex., will become the property of Texas Tech as the result of action June 29 of the Tech board of directors.

Tech is to get a quick-claim (non-restricted) deed to 6,000 acres of choice Panhandle farm land in the PanTex Ordinance area at the cost of little more than a fancy side-step.

In 1947, the United States government turned over the 17,000-acre tract to Tech for agricultural experimental purposes. Provisions in the contract—which had a recall clause—stated that the property would belong to Tech after 20 years. After the turn of the half-century, however, a multi-million dollar Atomic Energy plant was constructed on a portion of the land; and, legally, would have belonged to Tech in 16 years.

Under Secretary of the Army Earl D. Johnson described the government land-giving as one of the most radical he had known.

To salvage the atomic energy plant and land surrounding the plant for the government, the Department of the Army made Tech the proposition—with some help from members of Tech's board—that for a quick-claim deed to the government's recalled land, the government would give Tech a similar deed to its farm acreage. The board approved this proposal June 29.

So, just by a cat's whisker, Tech would have been the only institution of higher learning with its own plant for making atom bombs.

More Box Seats In Jones Stadium Opened To Public

Box seats between the 42-yard lines to all Texas Tech and Lubbock High School football games for the next five seasons are being made available.

Section O, on the East side, has been opened to the public and is being equipped with folding, theater-type seats in boxes of eight, six, and four.

To pay for the installation of the seats and to obtain the option for five years, box purchasers are being asked for \$150 in addition to the charge for season tickets. Options on six-seat boxes cost \$112.50; four-seat boxes, \$75. There are only a limited number of six- and four-seat boxes.

"Option payments, made out to the Texas Tech Foundation, earmarked Athletics, are deductible from income tax returns," Jimmie Wilson, business manager of athletics, pointed out.


Board Approves Budget For Year

Texas Tech's board of directors June 29 put the stamp of approval of Dr. E. N. Jones' budget in which the college will spend almost \$5,000,000 during the 1953-54 school year.

The \$4,972,075.03 budget includes \$1,713,301.30 for faculty salaries. Although the state legislature voted a \$300 raise across-the-board for college faculties, no monies were voted for the increase in pay. Tech raked up an average of \$245 per position raise out of its operational budget.

Other allocations were: General Administration, \$276,228; General Operating Expenses, \$167,900; The Library, \$177,050; Physical Plant Maintenance, Utilities, \$476,324; Extension, \$42,610; Organized activities, \$262,530.

Nolan Ellmore Barrick Named Head Of Architecture And Allied Arts

The president of Texas Tech, Dr. E. N. Jones, has announced the appointment of Nolan Ellmore Barrick as professor and head of the Department of Architecture and Allied Arts and Supervising Architect for the campus beginning Sept. 1.

Barrick, 39, is an associate professor of architecture and planning at the University of Texas and was acting director of the school of architecture at The University in the summer of 1952. He replaces Professor F. A. Kleinschmidt as head of the department and Robert Hedrick as supervising architect. Professor Kleinschmidt will be a full professor in the department. He was head of the department 25 years. The position of supervising architect has been vacant since Hedrick resigned in 1952 to become West Texas building supervisor for his brother, Wyatt Hedrick of Fort Worth.

Dr. Jones, in announcing the appointment of Barrick, said:

"This appointment represents the carrying out of a policy of the college in combining the academic and the practical application in as many administrative positions as possible.

"Mr. Barrick's background and training and experience qualifies him well to serve both as the new supervising college architect and the head of the Department of Architecture and Allied Arts. In welcoming Mr. Barrick, the college also pays tribute to the 25 years of service given by Professor F. A. Kleinschmidt who will remain as professor in the department."

Native Texan

Barrick was born Oct. 30, 1913, in Pearland, Texas. He graduated from John H. Reagan High School of Houston in 1931 and entered Rice Institute the same year. He received a BA degree in 1935, a BS in Architecture in 1936, and the MA in architecture in 1937.

As an undergraduate he won the

Mary Alice Elliott Travelling Fellowship in Architecture and was president of the Architecture Society in Rice. He is serving his second term as National president of Tau Sigma Delta, honor society in architecture and allied arts. Barrick has been a member of the committee on visual aids of the Association of Collegiate Schools of Architecture, since 1951.

His memberships include the American Institute of Architects and the Texas Society of Architects.

Professional Experience

After graduating from Rice in 1938 he worked a year as a designer of buildings for a building program at the Texas City Refinery, employed by the Pan-American Refining Corporation of Texas City. For two years he was architectural examiner for the Federal Housing Administration in Houston, and from 1940 to 1941 he was engaged in general practice in Houston. He was architect in charge of the design of buildings at the San Jacinto Ordnance Depot, Channel View, Texas in 1941, and was employed by Lockwood and Andrews and David M. Duller, architects-Engineers.

Barrick entered the Navy in February, 1942, as an Ensign and served until December, 1945, being discharged as a lieutenant. He received the Bronze Star for duty in the Pacific Theater during 1943-44. For a time he taught in the school of photographic interpretation; his courses were ship identification and a refresher course in architecture.

After his release from the Navy he took a position with Iowa State College as assistant professor of architecture, teaching the history of architecture and upper level design. Barrick rose to full professor before he went to the University of Texas in 1949 as an associate professor.

During his stay in Iowa, Barrick was associated with Leonard Wolf and Thomas K. FitzPatrick in general practice. His summers were spent in Houston as designer of hospital and church projects with various firms. Since 1949 he had conducted a general practice in Austin and Houston, doing mostly residential work. He was architect on the University Christian Church of Austin of which he is a deacon.

From 1934 to 1941, he worked in various positions for William W. Watkins, Architect, Houston. He married Rosemary Watkin in 1938, and they have two children, Bruce Watkin Barrick, 5, and Anne Hester Barrick, 16 months.

Texas Tech's Jones Stadium will be the site of a professional football game between the Chicago Cardinals and the Baltimore Colts Saturday night, Aug. 22. The game is being sponsored by the Lubbock Junior Chamber of Commerce.

Lewis N. Jones Receives Appointment As Dean Of Men Effective Sept. 1

The second ex-student to be made a dean at Texas Tech has been announced from the office of the dean of student life.

Lewis N. Jones, captain of the Red Raider line in 1936-37 and assistant dean of student life since 1950, will become dean of men effective Sept. 1. The position is not new, but was left vacant by the elevation of Dean James G. Allen to the student life deanship in 1950.

Dean Jones will be working on the staff of the dean of student life on the equal footing with the dean of women, Dean Marjorie Neely. Dean Allen will be responsible for the activities in both dean's departments.

"Lew" Jones is a native of Cleburne. He received his BA in History from Tech in 1938 and a master's in 1939. He coached at Mt. Pleasant for a time before becoming a member of the Navy Hospital Corps. He returned to Tech in 1947 as assistant dean of men and was made assistant dean of student life in 1950.

He is married to the former Hazel Gibson of Paducah and they have two children, Nancy Ann, 11, and Michael, 7.

His position will be taken over by James B. Whitehead, dormitory supervisor for Bledsoe Hall in 1951-52 and assistant dean of men at the University of Cincinnati in 1952-53. Whitehead holds two degrees from the University of Indiana.

The \$2,000 Hiram Parks Scholarship at Texas Tech for 1953-54 has been awarded to Maria Ramos, 20, of Shallowater.


The scholarship was set up in 1945 by Mr. and Mrs. Hiram Parks of Lubbock to encourage young people of Latin-American descent to continue their education through college.

Additions to the faculty announced previously include Dr. Willa Vaughn Tinsley, who will be dean of the Home Economics Division; Dr. John Clarkson Dowling, professor of foreign languages and head of the department; Robert Arthur Elson, Robert Boynton Taylor and Darrell Keith McCarty, all instructors in music, and Mrs. Darrell Keith McCarty, part-time instructor in music.

Staff changes, all previously announced, will include the new vice presidency of Dr. G. E. Giesecke, effective Sept. 1; the new directorship of Edward W. Smith of the Texas Tech Foundation; the elevation of Lewis N. Jones from assistant dean of student life to dean of men; the appointment of William Ray Geisert as head supervisor of men's dormitories and the assistant dean of men; and selection of James B. Whitehead as assistant dean of student life.

Other additions are Dr. Randolph Carrol Wilhoit, assistant professor of chemistry; Dr. Charles L. Riggs, associate professor of mathematics; Dr. John Arthur Manning, part-time assistant professor of speech; James Wayland Bennett, assistant professor of agricultural economics; Dodd Vernon, assistant professor of journalism, and Dwayne Lavergne Oglesby, assistant professor of finance.

Among the resignations are those of Dr. Lewis Manning Cline, distinguished professor of geology, who is returning to the University of Wisconsin, and Dean Margaret W. Weeks of the Home Economics Division, member of the original Tech faculty, who is retiring. Miss Jewell Brock, instructor in chemistry since 1948, is also retiring after 24 years of teaching.

Return From Leave

Returning from leave will be Dr. Joseph Thomas McCullen, Jr., associate professor of English, who has been teaching at the University of Missouri; Miss Lola Beth Green, instructor in English, who has been working on a doctorate at the University of Texas; Philip Eldon Dennis, associate professor of geology who has been employed in the food and agriculture organization of the UN in the office of the Minister of Economics, Baghdad, Iraq; Dr. Ernest Wallace, assistant dean of Arts and Sciences and professor of history, who has finished a year of study at Harvard University under a Ford Foundation grant; William E. Whittington, associate professor of accounting, who has been working on his doctorate at the University of Illinois, and Dr. Byron Robert Abernathy, professor of government, who has been chairman of the Texas Wage Stabilization Board in Dallas.

On Leave

There are eleven faculty members who will be on leave from academic duties. Joe L. Haddon, assistant professor of music and assistant director of the band, is in Teachers College, Columbia University, working toward a Doctor of Education degree. A former math instructor who has been on military leave, Johnathan Wattam Lindsay, will study for an advanced degree at UCLA.

Robert L. Mason, associate professor of mechanical engineering,

will devote his time to the office of campus engineer. John Henry Baumgardner and Harry Ray Burkhart, assistant professors of animal husbandry, are in service with the Air Force, Baumgardner with the Air Force ROTC at Tech and Burkhart with the unit at the University of Arizona, Tucson.

James Foote Adams and William Eugene Oden, instructors in government, will do doctorate work at the University of Chicago and Indiana University, respectively. Miss L. Katherine Evans, associate professor of education, will work on a doctoral fellowship at the University of Maryland.

Dr. Anderson Hunter Dupree, assistant professor of history, will do post-doctoral work at Harvard University, where Dr. Roy R. Male, Jr., assistant professor of English, will pursue work on a Ford Foundation grant.

Resignations

Other resignations include those of Miss Martye Poindexter, head of applied arts in the home economics division, who will devote her full time to a private business in Lubbock; Ira J. Schantz, instructor in music, who will spend the winter in New York, and James Edward Dykes, assistant professor of marketing, who has joined an advertising agency in St. Louis, Mo.

Mrs. Margaret D. Kimball, instructor in chemistry, plans to devote her time to her home.

Gordon E. Gatherum, assistant professor of agronomy, has joined the faculty of Colorado A. & M. at Fort Collins, and N. K. Peterson, also an assistant professor of agronomy, has accepted a research assistantship at Rutgers. D. H. Pinson, assistant professor of agricultural economics, will go into private business in Lubbock. Koy L. Neeley, associate professor of animal husbandry, will be vocational agriculture teacher at Paducah High School next year.

Two home economics instructors have resigned. Miss Kate Ellen Rogers, applied arts instructor, will work toward her doctorate at Columbia University, and Miss Mary Ella Crozier, child development instructor, will teach in Houston.

Instructors who have resigned but not made known their plans are James Arthur Rushing, English; Robert Harold Price, foreign languages; Francis Earl Green, geology; Robert Henry Dean, Jr., music; John Simpson McKaughan, Jr., architecture.

Edison Huxley Thomas, assistant professor of mathematics, and Miss G. Ellen Wright, assistant professor of clothing and textiles, have also resigned.

Former Tech Director Mark McGee, 64, Dies

Mark McGee, 64, widely known Fort Worth attorney, died July 15. He underwent surgery for a cancerous condition May 22.

Surviving are his widow and daughter, Mrs. George Clark, Jr., of Nacogdoches.

McGee served as a director of Texas Tech two terms, having been appointed to the board by Gov. W. Lee O'Daniel in 1939 and was reappointed by Gov. Coke Stevenson in 1945. He retired as a director in 1951 after serving two six-year terms and with three presidents of the college, Dr. Clifford B. Jones, Dr. W. M. Whyburn and Dr. D. M. Wiggins.

William D. Scott Appointed Head Of Student Union

William David Scott, 33, has been named as the new director of the Student Union Building effective Sept. 1.

At present, he is director of Mountainair student center at West Virginia University. Mr. Scott will replace Jesse Parrish, Tech senior, who has been director since the opening of the building in April.

A native West Virginian, Mr. Scott holds a BA degree in physical education from Marshall College, Huntington, W. Va., and a master's degree in education from the University of Michigan.

While in college, he was treasurer of his senior class, president of his social fraternity, president of the Inter-Fraternity Council, chairman of the Business Club and a member of the Student Council. He worked his way through college by helping in the college cafeteria and by operating a cleaning route.

He has spent the last five and a half years in his present position. Other professional experience includes a year as a 4-H Club agent, a term as coach at Plymouth High School in Michigan and six summers of camp work, one of which he spent as camp counselor at the National Music Camp at Interlochen, Mich.

Mr. Scott, married and the father of two young sons, visited on the Tech campus in June.

Carl L. Svensen Wins Award AT ASEE Meeting

Dr. Carl L. Svensen, Austin, executive secretary of the Texas State Board of Registration for Professional Engineers, won the annual service award of the engineering drawing division of the American Society for Engineering Education on June 24.

He received the award at a dinner at the 61st annual ASEE meeting held late in June at the University of Florida in Gainesville, Fla.

He is a member of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers, National Society of Professional Engineers, Society of American Military Engineers, Texas Academy of Architects and Texas Academy of Science and ASEE. He is a past president of the National Council of State Boards of Engineering Examiners.

Dr. Svensen, secretary of the registration board since 1942, is the author of nine books.

Drought Report By Secretary Benson Featured At American Cotton Congress

The American Cotton Congress, June 25-27, was probably the best "covered" news event in Lubbock and Tech in their histories.

Besides the state-wide and local daily and weekly newspapers and radio stations, many of the major TV networks, wire services, and large, national daily newspapers and trade journals had re-

presentatives on hand to report ACC events.

The event which brought reporters and newscasters in like flies around a syrup bucket was the appearance of Ezra Taft Benson, secretary of agriculture, who was reporting on the drought from this area. A build-up on the drought situation had accumulated in Washington, D. C., prior to Benson's coming to Lubbock, and he combined his appearance on the American Cotton Congress' program and a "first-hand-look" at the drought situation here.

Out of his speech at the Congress and a news conference following came the news that portions of Texas, Oklahoma, and New Mexico were declared disaster areas and subject to reduced freight rates, eligible for government loans, and permitted to buy government owned feeds for livestock.

On hand to report the news were NBC-TV, CBS-TV, Movie-tone News, Telenews Daily, KNY, Oklahoma City, The Daily News Record of New York, the New York Times, the St. Louis Post Dispatch, four national farm magazines, and 30 local and state-wide newspapers, radio stations, and magazines.

Don Gray, Texas Tech's co-captain from Breckenridge, had his appendix removed at Amarillo June 28. He is expected to recover in time for this season. Gray plays guard.

Tech To Construct Cinder Track

Texas Tech will have a cinder track by next spring.

The track was among athletic facilities approved June 29 by the Tech Board of Directors. Baseball diamonds, tennis courts, and a practice football field will also be built. They will be located in the vicinity of a huge fieldhouse being built by the City of Lubbock on the Tech campus.

Tech's old dirt track was considered fast enough under ideal conditions, but lack of suitable drainage sometimes made it unfit for regional meets. This spring, however, some of the best times in the state were run on it, including a 9.6 hundred yard dash mark by J. Frank Daugherty of Olton.

To go with the new track, Coach Landon Westbrook is also seeking top-notch athletes of the region. Already, several who placed in the state meet have signified that they will enter Tech this fall.

New Scholarship To Be Available For TE Freshman

A new scholarship for beginning Textile Engineers has been announced by Dean Dysart E. Holcomb of the Division of Engineering.

Dean Holcomb stated the Dallas Textile Club, an organization of individuals interested in textile fields, has agreed to sponsor a \$150 scholarship for beginning textile students beginning in the fall.

The engineering division is looking for applicants for the award.

To qualify, a high school graduate must have been in the upper 25 per cent of his graduating class and have an interest in textile engineering.

Under present plans, the engineering division will select the individual for the award and submit his name to the Dallas Textile Club for approval.

Club officials have stated that the club hopes to have four such awards going at once in the future; whereby, a student who maintains superior grades may have the scholarship renewed.

Board Okays Plans To Push Lubbock's Auditorium-Coliseum On Tech Campus

Plans to push along the city of Lubbock's \$1,750,000 auditorium-coliseum on the Tech campus were okayed in the June 29 board of directors' meeting.

A sub-committee, with full power to act for the college, was appointed to work out minor details

The board approved an expenditure of \$78,000 to open Sixth Street at College Avenue and bring it around the auditorium-coliseum site to join the super six-lane highway in front of the proposed new building. This would entail the moving of the Red Raiders practice field deeper into the campus, which is also included in the approved monies.

A cinder track, practice field, bleachers for 3,000, and dressing room facilities for 35 are in the plans when the old field is moved to an area West of the West Engineering Building.

Elo Urbanovsky, professor and head of the horticulture department and campus landscape artist, showed members of the board a mockup of the plans which will include beautification of most of the north end of the campus—with the exception of the gym.

Their names will also be placed before the Association Council Nov. 6. Other nominations for these offices can be made at the meeting.

Holdover directors will include Ralph Blodgett, Spearman; Paul New, Denver City; D. M. McElroy, immediate past president of Lubbock; and L. C. Walker, executive secretary of the Association.

The Nominating Committee is composed of Chairman Culver Hill, Lubbock; Don Wooten, McAdoo; J. S. Craddock, Jr., Colorado City; Edd C. McLeroy, Dimmitt; D. M. McElroy, Lubbock; and L. C. Walker.

The committee's selections were made on the basis of ability and geographical location of the nominees. The committee felt that a geographical consideration was necessary for the most effective operation of the Association.

Tech Enrollment Jumps To 5,398

The enrollment for Texas Tech reached a total of 5,398 as the final day for fall semester registration was completed on Oct. 30. The total represents an increase of about 4.4 per cent over the 1952 fall registration, and is the largest student body at Tech since the fall of 1950.

Of the total, 3,897 were men and 1,501 were women. The freshman class led the increase with exactly 1,900, the sophomore class numbered 1,097, and there were 913 juniors and 916 seniors. The present freshman class is the third largest in the history of the college.

Registrar W. P. Clement has said that Tech's enrollment 10 years from now may reach 8,000 or 9,000. He points out that the increased birth rate during war years has now crowded elementary schools. This increase in the lower levels of education will possibly be seen later on the college level.

The breakdown by divisions is as follows: Arts and Sciences, 1,531; Agriculture, 691; Business Administration, 1,098; Home Economics, 254; Engineers, 1,252; and Graduates, 572.

Kuykendall Foundation Of Lubbock Establishes \$10,000 Fund For Freshman Scholarships At Tech

Trustees of the Kuykendall Foundation of Lubbock have announced the establishment of \$10,000 in freshman scholarships at Texas Tech beginning this fall and extending over a five-year period.

Ten scholarships, worth \$200 each, will be awarded each fall through 1957 to worthy entering freshmen as selected by the Faculty Committee on Scholarships and Awards at Tech. Primarily designed for freshmen, a student who holds a Kuykendall Foundation Scholarship may apply for the award in subsequent years.

The \$10,000 gift is one of the larger scholarship grants given Tech.

The foundation is presenting the money to Tech through the Texas

Technological College Foundation. C. T. McLaughlin, Snyder chairman of the board of directors of the Tech Foundation, in acknowledging the gift, said:

"This is a fine illustration of the support which West Texans are giving to the program of education at Texas Tech."

President E. N. Jones stated: "Investment in a human element direct is the most rewarding, I am convinced. The Kuykendall Foundation is making a very wise investment in providing ten scholarships a year for five years. Texas Tech is deeply grateful to the trustees of the foundation for their support of the college in its efforts to provide scholarships for worthy students."

Applicants for the new awards

must live in the 19-county area of the South Plains. Other qualifications include good character, citizenship and scholarship, and genuine need. At least one of the 10 winners will be a graduate of Lubbock High School, the trustees specified.



Absence Changes Put Responsibility On Each Student

Responsibility for class attendance this year will be placed on the shoulders of the individual students, says Dr. E. N. Jones. The revised absence regulations, effective Sept. 19, divide students into two classes—those doing satisfactory work and those who are not.

The student doing satisfactory work is responsible for his own class attendance until his absences add up to two weeks of classes or until he misses a week of classes consecutively. Then a notice will be sent to the dean of his division.

The instructor reports the student doing unsatisfactory work when the total number of absences in the course, consecutive or otherwise, equals one week of classes, or when the total number of absences becomes sufficient to jeopardize his standing in the course. It is up to the instructor to decide when this point has been reached.

The new regulations discontinue negative hours, double cuts, and make-up cards.

"Records of Eligibility for Out-of-Town Trip" slips will continue to be used. Also, clinic, infirmary, and dormitory illness slips will continue to be used. Although there is no such thing as an "excused absence," these slips will help the instructor decide whether he will permit work to be made up. The student is responsible for all work of the course, whether present or not.

Ex-Student's Association?

(Editor's note: Knowing that the Ex-Students' Association of Texas Tech College, if it is to render an effective service to the College, needs loyal members and active chapters throughout Texas as well as the entire United States, this article is written to furnish information to all former students of Tech who may wish to become better acquainted with the Association, its organization, and its purposes.)

The Ex-Students' Association of Texas Tech, as the name implies, is an organization of former students. Membership is open to all students who have been enrolled in any of the regular college courses of Texas Tech, and all per-

sons who have received advanced or honorary degrees from the college. The Association exists because it is an expression of college loyalty which is the most human and American characteristic of the alumni and ex-students of any American college or university.

The organization of the Ex-Students' Association of Tech consists of the Association Council, the Executive Board, Athletic Council Representative, and local chapters. The governing body of the Association is the Association Council. Its membership includes one representative from each of the Association Districts, together with an ex-officio membership of each local chapter President, the members of the Executive Board, and the elected officers of each senior class and the president of the junior class. There are 29 Association Districts in Texas and seven Districts over the rest of the U. S.

The Council has a double responsibility. Besides being the governing body, it is responsible for the management, policies and program of the Association. It is the representative of the Association among the clubs, districts, and groups from which its members are drawn. The Council endeavors to assist the College and the Association in every possible manner and through its members secure the interest and co-operation of other members of the Association and friends of the College.

Nine members are elected to the Executive Board by the Council at its annual meeting. The President, vice presidents, immediate past President, Representative to the Athletic Council, and the Executive Secretary of the Association are members of the Board. The remaining three members, or directors, are elected to serve for three years—one elected each year to provide overlapping terms. The Board carries on the affairs of the Council between meetings, makes and presents to the Council an annual report and a budget of estimated revenue and expense, and directs and supervises the detailed features of the Association and its program.

The Executive Secretary-Treasurer performs such duties as the Executive Board may determine. He is the executive officer of the Association, attends all meetings of the Board and Council, and keeps all records and proceedings thereof. Under the direction of the Association, he conducts the correspondence, is responsible for the property of the Association, keeps a mailing list of former students and graduates, is in charge of all departments of the Association, co-operates with the College, and in a general way carries out such duties as may be assigned to him by the Executive Board. He is responsible for the receipt, disbursement, and proper acknowledgment of all moneys or other contributions and for the adequate accounting of the same.

The purpose of the Association are many and varied. Some of these are: to maintain the interest of the former student in Tech and Ex-Students' activities; to acquire a better understanding of the College's aims and ideals; to serve as a public relation organization between the College, former students and their respective communities; to serve as a publicity agency in interesting people of wealth in Texas Tech; to interest worthy students in attending Tech; and in general, to mobilize former students who have the desire to assist in satisfying the needs of their College.

One of the most important factors in a successful Association is the local chapter. Through its local chapters, or Texas Tech Clubs, the Association furnishes a meeting place where alumni and ex-students may gather for sociability and fellowship, renew old friendships and make new friends, all of whom have had similar experiences at Texas Tech. Active local chapters are an important need of the Association and of the College.

Soph Scholarship Winners Revealed

The winners of eight sophomore scholarships at Tech were announced last week and include two from Odessa and Lubbock and one each from Levelland, Lampasas, Quitaque, and Pass Christian, Miss.

Dean of Student Life James G. Allen, in announcing the winners, said the students would receive \$125 during the next nine-month school year. They were selected for outstanding scholastic achievements, character, and leadership abilities.



The other member of Dean Neely's staff is Mrs. Edna Eikel, resident hostess of Horn Hall who joined the Texas Tech family in 1944.


If Kinfolks Are in Lubbock Jody Will Find Them Soon

Red Raiders Win First Three Tilts; Upset Oklahoma A&M By 27-13 Score

In their first real test of the season, Texas Tech's Red Raiders smashed out a 27-to-13 victory over highly-regarded Oklahoma A&M at Stillwater on Oct. 3. It marked the third straight triumph for Tech, the first two wins of the season being over Border Conference opponents.

The upset victory over the Aggies was even easier than the score indicated. Tech built up a 21-to-0 halftime lead and the starting eleven saw only brief action in the second half. Coach DeWitt Weaver used 37 of the 40 players who made the trip to test the previously unbeaten Cowpokes.

Offensive star in the tilt was Jack Kirkpatrick, sophomore quarterback, who scored twice, kicked three extra points, and guided the offense smoothly on a rain-drenched field. Bobby Cavazos regained his last season running form as he carried 10 times for 68 yards. The Raider line held highly-touted Bill Bredde, A&M halfback, in check throughout most of the game, al-

though he did set up one of the Aggies' scores with a 45-yard scamper. He was the offensive star in A&M's victories over Hardin-Simmons University and the University of Arkansas.

Tech opened the grid season with a 40-to-14 victory over West Texas State, then trounced Texas Western, 27-6, for their second conference win. Highlight of the West Texas game was Kirkpatrick's 100-yard kickoff return for a TD. Halfback Don "Skeeter" Lewis took scoring honors in the Texas Western tilt as he crossed the goal line twice and picked up 107 yards in just four trips with the ball.

In posting a 3-0 record for the young season, the Raiders have shown a slashing ground attack with a host of sparkling backfield performers. Besides Kirkpatrick, Lewis and Cavazos, the Raider line has paved the way for James Sides, Pat Green, Norman Janes, Jojo Bryan and several others. And on defense, the Techs seemed much improved in

their last outing in Oklahoma. Co-Captains Don Gray and Vic Spooner, rugged Jerry Walker and Jimmy Williams, Howard Hurt, Dean White, and many others have led a stubborn line with outstanding defensive play.

SPORTS SHORTS—Up to the Oct. 3 game with Oklahoma A&M, there were still some 7,000 tickets available for the Texas A&M game at Lubbock Oct. 10. . . . Center Don Funk, who received a shoulder injury last season, has injured the same shoulder again and will be out the rest of the season. . . . Tech's first head football coach, E. Y. Freeland, died Aug. 17. . . . Tech's freshman football team, with some of the best recruits in many a year, looked impressive in swamping Clovis Air Force Base in their first tilt of the season. . . . TCU will make another appearance on the Tech schedule in 1955 with the game slated for Lubbock. . . . The Texas Aggies appearance here Oct. 10 marks the first trip to Lubbock for A&M since 1927.

Delta Gamma and Alpha Chi Omega, Greek letter sororities, have accepted invitations to colonize on the campus this fall. Delta Gamma has 77 active chapters and 200 alumnae clubs. It was founded at Lewis School in Oxford, Miss. As a national philanthropy, it devotes aid to sight conservation and to the blind. The Nursery School for the Visually Handicapped is maintained at Los Angeles, Calif. Scholarships are provided for training of specialists to work with the blind.

Around The Campus

Texas Tech opened its doors for the 29th consecutive year Sept. 17 with several changes in its curriculum, administration, and faculty.

A major change in engineering offerings went into effect with the new term. A new five-year plan is designed to give the graduate engineer a broad background in the social, natural, and political sciences. The five-year plan has been worked out with Baylor University and Hardin-Simmons University so that student engineers can take the three years of liberal arts work at one of the three schools—including Tech—prior to coming to Tech for the two years and a summer of engineering.

New in the administration for the 1953-54 school year are Dr. G. E. Giesecke, vice president in charge of academic life; Dr. Willa Vaughn Tinsley, dean of home economics; and Lewis Jones, dean of men.

Several departments have new administrative heads. Dr. John Dowling will take over the department of foreign languages upon the partial retirement of Dr. C. B. Qualia. Nolan E. Barrick comes to Tech as head of the department of architecture and allied arts to take over the administrative duties of Prof. E. A. Kleinschmidt.

On the non-teaching staff will be a former FBI agent and assistant district attorney for Dallas County, E. W. (Bud) Smith. He will head the department of development of the Texas Tech Foundation, which is a new office devoted to the promotion of special-activity financing for the college.

Tech started the fall term with about 306 individuals who will teach one or more subjects. The number, including eight of the original, is a far cry from the 35 faculty members who were at Tech when the college opened in 1925.

Dr. Gene Hemmle, head of the Music Department and Chairman of the Tech Artists Course Committee, has announced that Artists Course tickets have been placed on sale. He expects a larger number of seats to be available to the faculty and the general public than previously.

Tech's Adult Education Program began a series of radio programs over KSEL, Lubbock, at 9 p.m. on Monday, Sept. 21. These programs, entitled "The Monday Night Forum," will be in the form of round-table discussions of community problems. The series will be on the air each Monday for 13 weeks.

J. Norman Heard, Texas Tech Order Librarian, has published a book called "The Bookman's Guide to Americana." This book contains 6,600 titles of out-of-print books relating to the American scene and provides a selective yardstick for determining prices. W. C. Cole, manager of the

Tech Bookstore, will attend the Southwest Regional meeting of the National Association of College Stores in Austin, Nov. 28.

Dr. Joe Dennis, professor and head of the Department of Chemistry, will represent Tech among a group of educators to visit the Procter and Gamble Plant in Dallas, Oct. 24-28.

Dr. A. W. Young, professor and head of the Department of Agronomy, will represent Texas at the International Crop Improvement Association meeting Nov. 10-13 in St. Louis, Mo. Dr. Young is chairman of the Texas State Seed and Plant Board.

Dean W. L. Stangel, Division of Agriculture, will serve as general livestock superintendent of the State Fair of Texas in Dallas, Oct. 10-25. He will take off two days to represent Tech at the King Ranch Centennial Celebration in Kingsville on Oct. 18-19.

Parking Regulation Set For Tech

Dormitory students accustomed to riding to classes will find themselves on foot this semester as new campus parking regulations go into effect. Cars of such students must be parked in lots assigned to their dormitories, and no where else on the campus.

Applications which were passed out to car owners during registration announced that a parking fee of \$1 will be charged.

In an effort to relieve the traffic and parking congestion on the campus, a traffic committee has been created which will assign each driver a definite parking place.

The parking privileges will be enforced from 8 a.m. through 12 noon daily except Sundays and holidays.

Vehicles found parked on the campus without the permit will be given a courtesy ticket which is a reminder to the driver that a violation has occurred and asking his cooperation.

If a vehicle is found parked repeatedly on the campus without the parking permit it will be identified and proper action will be taken to remedy the violation in the future.

Tech Graduate Completes NMU Meteorology Courses

Lt. Billy F. Harris, 1952 Tech graduate from Breckenridge, has recently completed an Air Force program in meteorology at the University of New Mexico. The 57 hours of courses he took during his year's stay there was equivalent to two years of college work. The ex-Techan says he has three more years to serve.

He stated that of 66 students starting the courses only 41 finished. Seven of the total participating were Texans. Lt. Harris, agriculture education graduate, stated that about half of those completing the program would be assigned in the states and the other half overseas.

Fulbright Grant to Benefit Seniors, Grad Students

Seniors and beginning graduate students at Texas Tech have until Oct. 31 to apply for foreign study grants under the Fulbright Act and the Buenos Aires Convention for 1954-55.

Dr. G. E. Giesecke, academic vice president and campus Fulbright representative, announced the opening of study opportunities abroad. Details concerning grants and applications can be obtained at his office.

In general, the Fulbright Act will cover transportation, expenses of a language refresher or orientation course abroad, tuition, books, and maintenance for one academic year. The allowance is based on living costs in the country in which the award is tenable—and in the currency of the country. Transportation and maintenance of dependents are the responsibility of the grantee.

Before making application, applicants are expected to have a study plan which can be carried out profitably in a year.

Selection of students for grants under the two programs is based on the applicant's personal qualifications, academic record, value of proposed study or research, and suitability for placement in an institution of higher learning abroad. Sweden has withdrawn from the program for 1954-55.

"The college wishes to encourage its graduating seniors, graduates, and faculty to investigate such study grants," Dr. Giesecke said.

"We feel that such experiences will broaden the individual, making him a better teacher and giving him a better understanding of world problems."

HARRIS KEENE WILLIAMS, who graduated from Tech in August 1953, is employed at the Aberdeen Proving Ground in Maryland as a mechanical engineer.

More Scholarship Winners At Tech

Fourteen more scholarship winners have been designated at Texas Tech, the total of their awards exceeding \$3,000. Some of the awards were announced by the Faculty Committee on Scholarships and Awards and others were announced by division or department heads or other college officials.

Chester C. Jaynes, part-time instructor in agronomy and a research student, is a two-time winner with the renewal of a \$1,200 research grant from Goldthwaite Tex Toro Co. The grant will permit him to carry further his work with native and introduced grasses.
