Our Squadron was raised for A. Sidney Johnson's
Co. he was killed about the time we reached Corinth Miss
we then joined Gen John H. Morgan's command. In Sept
1862 our command went with Gen E. Kirby Smith to Ky.
Capt Gano raised his squadron to a regiment known as
The 3rd Ky Cavalry. I was made commissary of the Regiment
I was in several engagements, was at the battle of Perryville Ky
we covered Bragg's retreat to Big Hill, came back through
Richmond and Lexington Ky, had minor engagements
down through the State, was at the battle of Stone River
In July 1863 by an act of the Confederate Congress the office
of ~~the~~ Regimental Com. was abolished, and I was released
from duty. I was allowed to select my field of service. I came
back to Texas and served on the coast with Gen Slaughter in the
winter of 1863 and 4. In the Spring of 1864 I joined Col Jim
Bolin's command on the frontier of the Indian Nation, was on
detail service gathering supplies for the army at the close of the
