 George Washington, and under
 Gov. Dinwiddie's proclamation
 of 1754 and granted by Va

to Capt John Savage and
his Company of 60 men for
military service rendered
in the Indian and French
wars —

George Newman Brown,
my great grandfather, was
a Virginia soldier during
the war of the Revolution &
was at the Siege of Yorktown.

His wife Sarah, was the
daughter of Henry Hampton;
of Prince William County —

She made her home
with my grandfather after
the death of her husband.
She lived to be very old.
There are flowers in my

Grandfather's bible that
 she pressed & placed
 there — I think all
 the children stood in
 awe of her — my father
 thought his grandmother
 a very peppery old lady —
 We have no records
 of the Sampson family,
 I think likely you'll
 find something in my
 great grandfather's bible —
 His sons (George Herman Benson,
 Captains John & Robert H. Calver,
 William, George Herman, James
 and the son-in-law, Brew (very
 wealthy, were in the war of 1862
 in the East —

For the same I was Benjamin was
appointed to collect the ^{unofficial} revenue of the
My grandfather, Richard

a Major under Gen -
Harrison was in the
Northwest & at Fort Snigo.

I couldn't lay my hands
to day on the sketch
& which gives the genealogy
clear down from Sir William
to our family & I've copied,
this from a sketch given
of my father, Thomas
given in a history of
Kentucky & Pennsylvania

I'm sure I've given you
data of the rest -
My father had three
children - Mrs Brown - married

"Kentucky Biographies"

George Newman Brown ^{our} grandfather was a Virginia soldier in the Revolution and was in the siege of Yorktown. His wife, Sarah, was a daughter of Henry Hampton of Prince William County, Virginia, and near relative of the first General Wade Hampton, of South Carolina.

"Sarah, widow of George Newman Brown Esq. after death of her husband in 1814, removed from Prince William to Cabell County, and resided with her son Richard until her death about 1828 or 1830, aged about eighty." Died 1832 aged 82 yrs -

"Richard Brown (our grandfather) was a ^{lieutenant} ~~gentleman~~ and Major under Gen. Harrison in the Northwest and at Fort Meigs.

"Frances H. (our grandmother) was a daughter of Henry Haney of Bourbon County, Kentucky?"

The old Bible does not give the date of our great grandmother, nor the birth and marriage of grandmother, nor the death of Aunt Betty Gardner. Suppose the clerk of Bourbon Co. could find from the records the date of her marriage, her age at that time and thus approximate the year of her birth.

Could learn from Mollie W. the date of her grandmother's death. Last time we saw Mollie she told us she was living in Huntington and if we wrote to direct in care of "General Delivery?"
