July County Court 1866

Ordered that the following boundary be laid off as a Patrol District, in this County - Lewis: Beginning at the North fork at the Lewis and Fleming County line, and from thence with the State Road to the crossing of Cabin Creek, near the Bethel Meeting house - and from thence of said Creek to the Three Island Road, and then with the Three Island Road, to the Ohio River at Wilsons Ferry, below Manchester, and down the Ohio River to the Lewis County line, and then with the County line, to the North fork, and thence up the same to the Beginning. Shall be one Patrol District, to be called and known by District No 2, - And It is Ordered that Samuel R. Ireland, be appointed as Captain of the patrol in the said District. And it is Ordered that Alfred Brewer, & Dudley Tolle, be appointed to patrol under him, in said District as the law requires. And that said Patrollers Patrol Twelve hours in each month for the term of one year.

Dear Sir

For my second negligence in not answering Your letter previous to Yours last. I must plead Business of the most arduous kind — Your description of the Sugar loaf Rock I have spread abroad in every direction But no such Rock has been seen though I still encourage the Country People with every prospect that I receive from You — and indeed it does seem passing strange that it cannot be found — With the assurances that I have from You — surely it must be here — I shall remain here this Year; and shall be glad ^{to} keep up our correspondence — Let the matter turn out as it may — My situation gives me double the advantage that it did last Year — Being at the Mill I see the hole of the Country ~~people~~ a mob and will be glad to receive any information that You may ~~see~~ in Your judgement impart to me — You did not say whether the Rock was upon the Top or side of the Mountain — Be Particular and I may yet find it —
