AFTER RECESS

The Convention met at 9:30 o'clock a.m., pursuant to recess, and was called to order by the Vice-President.

(President in Chair)

The roll was called and the following were recorded present: 158 Present, 12 Absent-excused, 11 Absent. (Record 1, Appendix)

The Reverend Dr. Ralph M. Smith, Chaplain, offered the invocation as follows:

Dear Heavenly Father:

Help us to live this day for God and may we be a blessing to our fellowman.

Forgive us of our sins. Too often we play the part of the hypocrite, pretending we are something we are not. Unmask us and help us to see ourselves as You see us.

Remind us that righteousness exalteth a nation but sin is a reproach to any people. May Thy will be done in our individual and collective efforts.

In Jesus' name, Amen.

ARTICLE X ON SECOND READING

The President laid before the Convention as unfinished business Article X, Section 19, with an amendment pending.

Question: Shall the amendment be adopted?

Delegate Patman offered the following substitute for the amendment:

Amend Article X by deleting Section 19 therefrom, renumbering Section 20 so as to become Section 21, and appropriately renumbering succeeding sections, and including a new Section 19 and a new Section 20, to read in their entirety as follows:

Sec. 19. AUTHORITY OF THE LEGISLATURE TO CLASSIFY LOANS AND LENDERS, LICENSE AND REGULATE LENDERS, DEFINE INTEREST, AND FIX MAXIMUM RATES OF INTEREST; USURY; RATE OF INTEREST WHERE ABSENT IN CONTRACT; POWERS NONDELEGABLE. The legislature shall have the authority to classify loans and lenders, license and regulate lenders, define interest, and fix maximum rates of interest.

In the absence of legislation fixing maximum rates of interest, all contracts for a greater rate of interest than 10 percent per annum shall be deemed usurious.

In contracts where no rate of interest is agreed upon, the rate shall not exceed 6 percent per annum.

The powers of the legislature to classify loans and lenders, define interest, and fix maximum rates of interest shall not be subject to delegation by the legislature to any board or governmental agency.

Sec. 20. In exercising its powers to fix maximum rates of interest, the legislature shall not establish a rate that exceeds 10 per centum per annum.

The substitute for the amendment was read.

On motion of Delegate Nugent, and by unanimous consent, the amendment was withdrawn.

On motion of Delegate Patman, and by unanimous consent, the substitute for the amendment was withdrawn.

DELEGATE PRESENT

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Delegate Lee who had previously been recorded as "Absent" was announced "Present".

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Delegate Lombardino was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of medical reasons on motion of Delegate Weddington.

Delegate Nugent offered the following amendment to Section 19 of Article X:

Amend Article 10, Section 19 by striking Section 19 of the committee report and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

Section 19. AUTHORITY OF THE LEGISLATURE TO CLASSIFY LOANS AND LENDERS, LICENSE AND REGULATE LENDERS, AND FIX MAXIMUM RATES OF INTEREST; USURY; RATE OF INTEREST WHERE ABSENT IN CONTRACT; POWERS NONDELEGABLE. The legislature shall have the authority to classify loans and lenders, license and regulate lenders, and fix maximum rates of interest, not in excess of 10 percent per annum.

In the absence of legislation fixing maximum rates of interest, any rate of interest greater than 10 percent per annum shall be deemed usurious.

In contracts of any character where no rate of interest is agreed upon, the rate shall not exceed 6 percent per annum.

The powers of the legislature to classify loans and lenders and fix maximum rates of interest shall not be subject to delegation by the legislature to any board or governmental agency.

Interest as used herein means the sum of all charges payable directly or indirectly by the debtor and imposed directly or indirectly by the lender as an incident to the extension of credit.

The amendment was read.

Delegate Gammage moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 86 Yeas, 61 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 33 Not Voting. (Record 2, Appendix)

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Delegate Cobb was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Newton.

Delegate Barnhart moved the Previous Question on Section 19.

The motion was duly seconded.

The Previous Question was ordered by the following vote: 96 Yeas, 59 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 25 Not Voting. (Record 3, Appendix)

Section 19 was adopted by the following vote: 132 Yeas, 22 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 26 Not Voting. (Record 4, Appendix)

REASONS FOR VOTE

Reason for voting "Yea" on Article X, Section 19:

All amendments to set a fixed ceiling on interest rates would repeal existing law and disrupt over 8 million loans in Texas. This is a legislative matter and should not be a part of the Constitution except as stated in the committee report.

I voted "Nay" on the adoption of Section 19 of Article X by the Convention because "de novo" appeal from the decisions of the administrative agency in charge of regulation should have been maintained to protect all parties, consumer and lender alike. I prefer judicial determination of the ultimate facts in any decision affecting interest rates to an administrative ruling only.

Delegate Doggett explained Section 20 of Article X.

Delegate Doggett offered the following amendment to Section 20, Article X:

Amend Article X, Section 20 to read as follows:

Section 20. RIGHTS OF THE HANDICAPPED. A person may not be denied any right, benefit, or opportunity on the basis of a physical or mental handicap, as defined by law, except to the extent a handicap prevents work performance in employment or as otherwise provided in this Constitution or as prescribed by law in the regulation of commerce. This guarantee is self-operative.

Delegate Williamson offered the following substitute for the amendment:

Amend Section 20 of Article X, the General Provisions Committee report, by striking all after the heading, "RIGHTS OF THE HANDICAPPED," and substituting therefor the following: No person shall be denied any right, benefit, or opportunity by act of the state on account of a physical or mental handicap, except under reasonable exceptions provided by law.

The substitute for the amendment was read.

DELEGATES PRESENT

Delegates Montoya and Temple who had previously been recorded as "Absent" were announced "Present".

Delegate Sage moved to table the

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amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by a non-record vote.

DELEGATES PRESENT

Delegates Scoggins and Hudson who had previously been recorded as "Absent" were announced "Present".

Delegate Mengden offered the following substitute for the amendment to Section 20 of Article X:

Amend Article X by striking Section 20 and renumbering all remaining sections accordingly.

The substitute for the amendment was read.

Delegate Wieting moved to table the substitute for the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 133 Yeas, 20 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 27 Not Voting. (Record 5, Appendix)

REASON FOR VOTE

I voted "Nay" on Record Vote 5 because I thought it would be better to remain silent on the subject than to put a self-enacting provision in the constitution containing ambiguous wording.

Delegate Mengden offered the following substitute for the amendment to Section 20 of Article X:

Amend Section 20, Article X, by striking all of Section 20 and substituting the following in lieu thereof:

Section 20. RIGHTS OF HANDICAPPED

No person shall be denied any right, benefit, responsibility, or opportunity, including the opportunity for employment, on account of a physical or mental handicap if otherwise qualified, except as provided by law.

The substitute for the amendment was read.

LEAVES OF ABSENCE

Delegate Kubiak was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Geiger.

Delegate Wolff was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Traeger.

Delegate Doggett moved to table the substitute for the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 128 Yeas, 24 Nays, 2

Present-Not Voting, 27 Not Voting. (Record 6, Appendix)

PAIRED VOTE

Delegate Geiger (present), who would vote "Nay", with Delegate Kubiak (absent), who would vote "Yea".

The amendment was then adopted by a non-record vote.

Section 20 was then adopted by the following vote: 133 Yeas, 19 Nays, 2 Present-Not Voting, 27 Not Voting. (Record 7, Appendix)

PAIRED VOTE

Delegate Geiger (present), who would vote "Nay", with Delegate Kubiak (absent), who would vote "Yea".

RECESS

On motion of Delegate Geiger the Convention at 11:55 o'clock a.m. took recess until 1:30 o'clock p.m. today.

AFTER RECESS

The President called the Convention to order at 1:30 o'clock p.m., pursuant to recess.

DELEGATES PRESENT

Delegates Henderson and Lombardino who had previously been recorded as "Absent-excused" were announced "Present".

Delegate Ogg who had previously been recorded as "Absent" was announced "Present".

LEAVES OF ABSENCE

Delegate Bowers was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Henderson.

Delegate McKinnon was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Newton.

Delegate Braecklein was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of illness on motion of Delegate Clower.

ARTICLE X ON SECOND READING

The President laid before the Convention as unfinished business Article X.

Delegate Doggett explained Section 21 of Article X.

(Delegate Craddick in Chair)

Delegate Schwartz moved to table Section 21 of Article X.

(President in Chair)

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 97 Yeas, 57 Nays, 2

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Present-Not Voting, 25 Not Voting. (Record 8, Appendix)

PAIRED VOTE

Delegate Blythe (present), who would vote "Nay", with Delegate McKinnon (absent), who would vote "Yea".

DELEGATES PRESENT

Delegates Bigham and Lauhoff who had previously been recorded as "Absent-excused" were announced "Present".

Delegate Doran explained Section 22 of Article X.

Delegate Powers moved to table Section 22 of Article X.

The motion to table was lost by the following vote: 73 Yeas, 85 Nays, 4 Present-Not Voting, 19 Not Voting. (Record 9, Appendix)

PAIRED VOTES

Delegate Tupper (present), who would vote "Yea", with Delegate McKnight (absent), who would vote "Nay".

Delegate Lewis (present), who would vote "Nay", with Delegate Johnson (absent), who would vote "Yea".

Delegate Spurlock (present), who would vote "Yea", with Delegate Russell (absent), who would vote "Nay".

REASON FOR VOTE

I believe the right-to-work law provision should be presented to the voters as an alternate submission. The citizens of the State of Texas have a right to vote on this important issue and to decide if it should be added to our Constitution. I shall support this proposal as an alternate submission. However, I feel that placing too many controversial issues within the main document endangers its passage, and if the entire proposed Constitution fails we have accomplished nothing.

GRANT

Question recurring on the adoption of Section 22 of Article X, shall Section 22 of Article X be adopted?

Delegate Doran offered the following amendment to Section 22 of Article X:

Amend Article X by striking Section 22, renumbering the following sections and adding the following proposal:

BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED,

That the following be submitted to the voters as a separate proposal, which, if adopted by the majority of the electors voting on the question, shall amend Article X of the proposed Constitution by adding a new section thereto, or if adopted by a majority

of the electors voting on the question and if the proposed Constitution is not adopted, shall amend Article XVI of the Constitution of 1876 by adding a section thereto to read:

Sec. ____ RIGHT TO WORK. (a) No person shall be denied employment on account of membership or nonmembership in a labor organization or payment or nonpayment of any dues, fees, or other sums of money or things of value to a labor organization.

(b) Any contract, agreement, understanding, or practice, written or oral, which requires or prescribes that employees or applicants for employment as a condition of employment shall or shall not be or remain members of a labor organization or shall or shall not make payments to a labor organization shall be null and void and against public policy.

(c) In this section, "labor organization" means any organization of any kind, or any agency or employee representation committee or plan, in which employees participate and which exists for the purpose, in whole or in part, of dealing with employers concerning grievances, labor disputes, wages, rates of pay, hours of employment, or conditions of work.

The amendment was read.

Delegate Scoggins offered the following amendment to the amendment:

Amend the Doran amendment to Article X by striking Section 22 and substituting in lieu thereof:

BE IT FURTHER PROPOSED,

That the following be submitted to the voters as a separate issue:

PROPOSAL NO. ____

(1) That in the event the proposed new constitution is adopted, the following section shall be added to Article X.

Section 22. RIGHT TO WORK.

It shall be unconstitutional and against public policy of the State of Texas for any person as a condition of employment to be required to be a member of any organization which bargains collectively in respect to rates of pay, wages, hours of employment, or other conditions of employment, or to pay dues or monies to any representative for the purpose of collective bargaining in respect to rates of pay, wages, hours of employment, or other conditions of employment; and the legislature is expressly prohibited from enacting any law against this public policy.

(2) That in the event the proposed new constitution is not adopted, Article III of the Constitution of 1876 be amended by adding a new Section 66 to read as follows:

Section 66. RIGHT TO WORK.

It shall be unconstitutional and against public policy of the State of Texas for any person as a condition of employment to be required to be a member of any organization which bargains collectively in respect to rates of pay, wages, hours of employment, or other conditions of employment, or to pay dues or monies to any representative for the purpose of collective bargaining in respect to rates of pay, wages, hours of employment, or other conditions of employment; and the legislature is expressly prohibited from

enacting any law against this public policy.

The amendment to the amendment was read.

On motion of Delegate Scoggins and by unanimous consent the amendment was withdrawn.

Delegate Mauzy offered the following amendment to the amendment:

Amend Subsection (c), Section 22 by inserting the words "The State Bar of Texas" after the word "means".

The amendment to the amendment was read.

Delegate Hutchison raised the Point of Order against further consideration of the amendment because it was not germane to the amendment it seeks to amend.

The President sustained the Point of Order.

DELEGATE PRESENT

Delegate Kubiak who had previously been recorded as "Absent-excused" was announced "Present".

Delegate Gammage offered the following substitute for the amendment:

Amend Article X, Section 22 by striking the section and substituting the following:

Section 22. RIGHT TO WORK. (a) No person shall be denied employment on account of membership or nonmembership in a labor organization, professional or vocational organization or association or payment or nonpayment of any dues, fees, or other sums of money or things of value to a labor organization, professional or vocational organization or association.

(b) Any contract, agreement, understanding, or practice, written or oral, which requires or prescribes that employees or applicants for employment as a condition of employment shall or shall not be or remain members of a labor organization, professional or vocational organization or association, or shall or shall not make payment to a labor organization, professional or vocational organization or association, shall be null and void and against public policy.

(c) In this section, "labor organization" means any organization of any kind, or any agency or employee representation committee or plan, in which employees participate and which exists for the purpose, in whole or in part, of dealing with employers concerning grievances, labor disputes, wages, rates of pay, hours of employment, or conditions of work.

(d) In this section, "professional or vocational organization or association" means any organization or association the membership of which consists of persons duly authorized to practice a profession or vocation under the laws of this state.

The substitute for the amendment was read.

Delegate Cates was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of illness in family on motion of Delegate Laney.

Delegate Williamson moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 98 Yeas, 63 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 19 Not Voting. (Record 10, Appendix)

Delegate Schieffer moved the Previous Question on the pending amendment and Section 22 of Article X.

The Previous Question was ordered by the following vote: 80 Yeas, 79 Nays.

Delegate Clower requested a verification of Record 11. The verification was ordered and reflected the following: 80 Yeas.

By unanimous consent, verification of those voting "Nay" was dispensed with.

The President announced the vote as follows: 80 Yeas, 79 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 21 Not Voting. (Record 11, Appendix)

Question recurring on the adoption of the amendment by Delegate Doran, the amendment was adopted by the following vote: 94 Yeas, 65 Nays, 3 Present-Not Voting, 19 Not Voting. (Record 12, Appendix)

PAIRED VOTES

Delegate Lewis (present), who would vote "Yea", with Delegate Johnson (absent), who would vote "Nay".

Delegate Spurlock (present), who would vote "Nay", with Delegate Russell (absent), who would vote "Yea".

Question on the adoption of Section 22 as amended, Section 22 as amended was adopted by the following vote: 96 Yeas, 64 Nays, 2 Present-Not Voting, 19 Not Voting. (Record 13, Appendix)

PAIRED VOTE

Delegate Spurlock (present), who would vote "Nay", with Delegate Russell (absent), who would vote "Yea".

REASON FOR VOTE

I cast my vote "Yea" for the motion to table General Provision Committee Proposal, Section 22, Right to Work.

At this point in time the product of the Constitutional Convention, with a few exceptions, is an acceptable one to me, and I believe to the voters of Texas.

If the right to work principle should be included in the Constitution of Texas is a question, I feel that as delegates we should allow the people of Texas to place it there themselves.

I do plan to vote for a separation submission of the right to work issue to the

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people of Texas. By the utilization of the separate submission alternative, the voters can decide upon this particular issue - apart from their consideration of the Constitution as a whole. I fear that right to work by its very nature would endanger the passage of the new Constitution if it were included in the basic document.

The Committee on Rights and Suffrage submits herewith its report on Constitutional Convention Resolution 34.

A substitute amendment was offered to change the language of Constitutional Convention Resolution 34 to read the same as the second reading version of Article XI,

Section 1 of the proposed new constitution. The submitted resolution was drafted prior to Style and Drafting Committee changes, and this amendment merely caused Constitutional Convention Resolution 34 to conform with Style and Drafting language changes. The amendment passed by a vote of 18 Yeas and 0 Nays.

The committee believed that sufficient doubt exists as to whether Article XVII of the 1876 Constitution presently permits amending the constitution on an article-by-article basis. Therefore, the proposed Article XI, Section 1, would be valuable as part of the 1876 Constitution should the constitution proposed by this convention fail to be adopted by the voters. Therefore, the committee approved Constitutional Convention Resolution 34, as amended, by a vote of 18 Yeas and 0 Nays.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Constitutional Convention of Texas, That the Committee on Submission and Transition be authorized to provide in its report that Article XI, Section 1 of the proposed constitution will be submitted to the voters as a separate proposal that would, if the new constitution is not adopted, amend the 1876 Constitution by deleting Article XVII, Section 1 and substituting Article XI, Section 1 of the constitution proposed by the convention.

Article XI, Section 1 is as follows:

Sec. 1. AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION.

(a) The legislature may propose amendments to this constitution by a record affirmative vote of two-thirds of the membership of each house. The legislature shall limit a proposed amendment to the revision of all or part of one article, except that the amendment may revise parts of other articles that are germane to the revision of the principal article.

(b) A proposed amendment must be submitted to the people at the next statewide general election or at a special election held on a date specified by the legislature. In no event is an election on a proposed amendment to take place less than 90 days after the legislature proposes the amendment.

(c) Proposed amendments must be publicized in the English language and any other language prescribed by law. The legislature shall prescribe by law the procedure for publicizing proposed amendments.

(d) A proposed amendment is adopted if approved by a majority of the qualified voters voting on the question and becomes a part of this constitution on the date that the statewide returns of the election are canvassed.

COMMENTS

The section would be submitted to the voters as an amendment to the 1876 Constitution. Article XI, Section 1 would also be included in the main body of the proposed new constitution. If the new constitution is approved, Article XI, Section 1 would be a part of that document. If the new constitution is rejected by the voters, the separate proposal, if approved, would

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allow Article XI, Section 1 to be incorporated into the 1876 document. The wording of the ballot and any necessary schedule provisions would also appear in the Submission and Transition Committee report.

This proposal is offered to ensure that, if the new constitution is not approved, it will be possible to revise the present constitution on an article-by-article basis. Section 1(a) of this proposal states that:

The legislature may propose amendments to this constitution by a record affirmative vote of two-thirds of the membership of each house. The legislature shall limit a proposed amendment to the revision of all or part of one article, except that the amendment may revise parts of other articles that are germane to the revision of the principal article.

The constitutional convention has devoted a great deal of effort and time toward writing a constitution that will be suited to the needs of present and future generations of Texans. Likewise, the Constitutional Revision Commission spent eight months conducting preparatory research and preparing a draft document for consideration by the convention. As a result of these combined efforts, the product of the convention's deliberations will be a document that is substantially improved both in form and substance.

Despite these circumstances, the record in other states which have held constitutional conventions in recent years indicates the acceptability of the final product by the voters cannot be predicted with certainty and may depend partly on factors beyond the control of the convention. In the event the proposed constitution is not approved by the voters, the adoption of Article XI, Section 1 as an amendment to the present constitution will ensure that the work of the constitutional convention can be of enduring value to the people of the state.
