Cabin Creek August 8th 1857

Dear Son

I Recd your letter this morning was
glad to hear from you all and to hear your
thoughts pomeela had improved. We are all
as well as usual. except the prostration of
my heart hurt me for a few days quite bad
I think if my affection in your mother
mind it is better than it has been for quite
weeks back. I have no news from Iowa
I had heard you was beat what I expected
I heard Mason had got up in Grand with
money. I had not time to let you know with
out coming up they at Maysville wanted
to send money up in your County I do not
know whether they did or not. if I could
of left home I would of come up on Friday or
Saturday before the election from Maysville
they would of sent money. I could of found
Judge Bryan if I could not of found
you. I need your greatest danger
was in your friends being to change
your election and I was satisfied
they would be quite excited. made
to keep you. I am sorry you are beat
but I have no doubt it is best for you
I have no doubt that Masons money helped
beat Thammis

it hurts me to write to day. I think my
heart will be better in a few days after
the excitement of the Election get over
for excitement hurts me. and being in the
sun. I have had to be out a good deal
this summer and fear had from it
write often. Come down as soon
as you can I would be glad to see
Fannella and the Children -

may want give her. This I know
you will cheerfully do.
There is nothing more that I wish to
trouble you with. My love to all -
God bless you.
