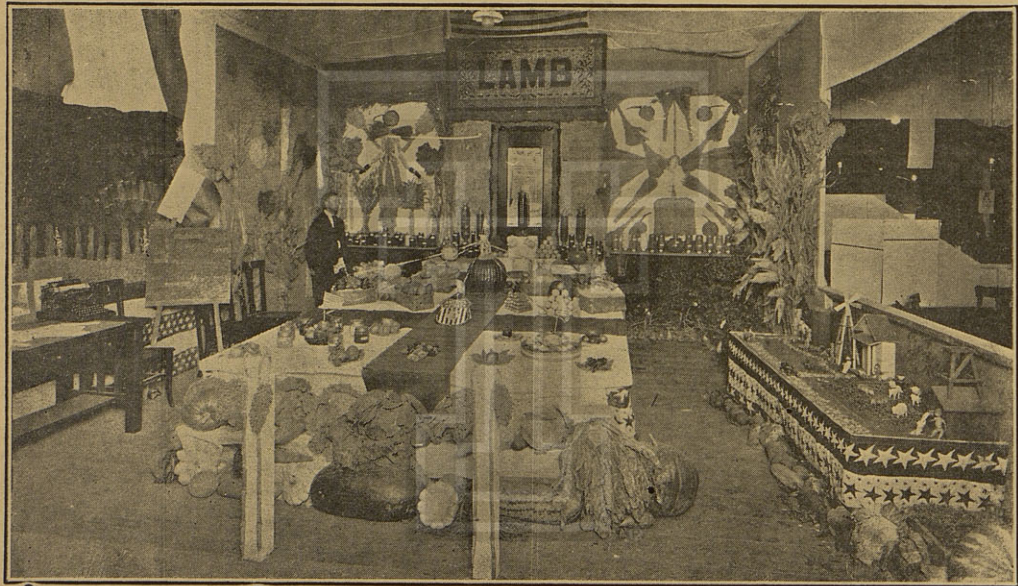




Lamb County Exhibit, State Fair, 1917. Arranged and decorated by Campbell J. Duggan, Littlefield, Texas.
