no falling weather of any kind.

Park Chop for breakfast.
Alice fed the old cat with three
of her bitters -

31 Mon. Clear, M. 72°. Thru b. and

tackling on foot comfort. A Bow tie

Looking for our pensions. Never came.
We both lay down PM. I got up at 2 PM. Alice at 2:30.

September, 1964.

3. Clear. M. 74. I got up at 5 a.m.
waited for the trash wagon.
It never came. Ricon up after 6 a.m.
Threw b. and dishes before 7 a.m.
I put rain water on to heat to
wash. (7 a.m.) Through washing
by 8 o'clock. I hung out. I
We both lay down after dinner.
Up at 1:45 P.M. Still no pensions
or (no mail man.)

We got our pensions - the mail man
had put them in Mrs. Mitchell's mailbox.
She brought them to us.

on front gallery till garbage
truck came by. Threw my sack of
cans in it. We had Park Chap

We each put \$20.00 a piece in grocery
pocket book. We were through
eating dinner as the clock struck 12.

and family to church.

● met them upon 13 Ave.

Back home at 12 O'clock.

Alice had dinner near ready.

I went to Safeway. A bill for \$7.40.
Back home by 10:30 O'clock.
A nice breeze from South West.
We were thru dinner before 11 A.M.
We both lay down. Up at 2 P.M.
The old train came from brick yard.
Had only 1 box car.

Heard Thelma Kloss. Lou Ellen came to use Tel. Reported Boss Hay's sister, Ida died. We lay down P.M.

I was up first. I mowed a little and put the mower up. I washed out the "Bird" water pan. Filled it up again.

13. Sunday. I went to S.S. Church

I had shaved. Alice did not try to go. Home by 12 o'clock.

I gave Bible questions to Training Union. I went to T.V. and night services.

Bro. W. H. McQuary preached at a.m. & p.m. services. no visible results. I was back home at 8 o'clock.

14. Cloudy. M. 66°. Thru b. and dishes by 6:30 a.m. Bacon & gravy for breakfast.

We had visitors from Sayre, Okla. Thelma Lilla Locke, Pauline Maddox, Bob Maddox, Para Hay. John Haywick, 4 1/2 Maddox.

cont'd. September, 1965.

14 We both lay down. Bath up
at 1:30 P.M. Cool west wind.

Ordered 2 555 and 2 ^{tax 9¢} Symplo B. V. #4.37

15 Cloudy, M. 66°. no wind.

● Thru b. and dishes by 5 m. of 7 o'clock.
Sausage for breakfast.

I taxied to City hall to vote.

Went to P. O. and Variety store.

I voted no on every amendment!

Home by 9:10 o'clock. Quit raining.

Gagne showed not a drop. I wrote cards
to Edwin, Mabelle, and Bela and Orleans.

I rewrote the story about Larry and
Bernice disputing about each of them
calling thier babies Larry if thier
babies were boys. I am sending
the story to Reader's Digest.

Of course it only costs 5¢ to send it.
Beal brought us butter milk and
good old Country butter - yum, yum!
Brought Velva's 3 children with him.

We both lay down P.M. Both up after 2:20 p.m.

Bud Whitley came near 2:15 P.M.
to fix Alice's machine. It breaks the
thread. He fixed it so it run OK.

20. We both got ready and went
to S.S. and Church. Home by 12:10 P.M.
(I had shaved) Ed & Carrie came
Workman.

I went to night services.

Never had any T.V. A man from
Los Angeles, Calif. talked.

Bro. Stewart reviewed the book
"Reaching all Prospects" the second
chapter. Home by 7:30 P.M.
Fining.

21. Cloudy. Raining. Gagne showed
2 inches of rain. Through b.
and the dishes at 6 o'clock.

September, 1964.

22. Cloudy. M. 72°. Thru b. and dishes at 5:40 A.M. Bacon far b. and one scrambled egg, and a cup of Maryland Coffee each. No wind. The garbage truck got stuck near the R.R. Finally got out. Near 7 O'clock. At 10 A.M. at 8 O'clock Alice had the ice box defrosted. Sun trying to shine. I pulled edge grass by the garden. Raining at 25 minutes after 10 O'clock. 30 Cloudy, M. 60°. Through breakfast and breakfast dishes at 5 m. of 6 o'clock. Park Chop for breakfast.

Beal had brought us butter and butter milk. Yum, yum!

I lay off my garden rows with the scratcher (5 little sweeps). Not too wet.

Paid Larry Langhery for Index for Oct. 2.50

Set heater up by back room door. I opened up the rows I had scratched in garden with the little end of my old garden hoe. Soft and plenty wet.

The Clock had stopped - ran down. Alice wound it and set it.

(near 11 A.M.) Alice sorting quilt scraps. I hoed weeds out of the garden.

Mrs. Whitley came. Mary Paints wife and her mother had just left.

Alice went down to see how Mrs. Budder was.

4 (Sun) Clear. M. 60°. Turn breakfast
and dishes by 6:30 A.M. A slight breeze.

Park chops for breakfast. S. and Church.

I shaved. Dressed for S. and Church.
Alice laid out her clothes to go.

But felt too bad to go.

I was home near 12 o'clock. We lay down P.M.

October, 1964.

I put rain water on to heat to wash. Through washing and hanging out at 8:15 o'clock.

I packed all my old scrap iron to yard fence inside. Nettie came and taken us out to our old home. Got 4 gallons of mineral water. Home after 4 o'clock.

9 Clear. M. 50°. Thru b. and dishes 6 o'clock. Bacon for breakfast. I burned trash in an (7 o'clock). Lou Ellen Harrah came used telephone.

10. Cloudy, M. 46°. No wind. Through breakfast and the dishes by 6:30 a.m.

Park chops for breakfast. I called Mr. Bishop. Promised to come to buy my old iron. Went to Safeway - a bill for \$2.36.

Contd. October, 1964.

10. Mr. Bishop, the junk man came and bought my old iron. Gave me \$50 for it. I had it all piled in side the yard at the front.

Alice and I lay down. I was up before 2 o'clock. Stepped my garden - 8 steps long. Have 8 rows laid off. Measured with yard stick - 24 ft. 8 lengths of yard stick.

Thelma & Beal sent us a baguet from Florist. Brought me 2 bottles of after shave lotion. Velva's kids brought to us.

Alfred and Mary came. Brought David Earnest and wife and baby girl - 5 mos. old and weighed 15 lbs on my scales. Another great Grand child!

11. my 87 birthday and our 61 wedding anniversary. Clear. mercury 50°. Thru b. and dishes at 6:30 a.m. Sausage for breakfast.

visiting relatives were Alfred and Mary, their boy, David Earnest and wife and baby girl, Mary Susie, Emmet and Tony Maddox, Barbara Philips and five children - 3 girls and 2 boys, Minnie Locke, Lawrence's widow, Don & Mary Alice

October, 1964.

12. Solid Cloudy. No wind.
Through breakfast and the few
dishes near 7 o'clock. Bacon for b.
I sorted out old letters. Had a
drawer full of them. Put a
flat square box full of them
under the bed in back room.

is Paints real name. I pulled edge grass

21 Velva Ruth Stewart came. Brought us butter and butter milk ($\frac{1}{2}$ gal.).

Her husband was Tommy Stewart.
22 Clear. M. 47°. no wind. I was up at 5:30. Alice up at 6:00 clock.

Through breakfast and dishes at 6:55 AM. Sausage for breakfast. Alice gathered up washing to send out to Beavers Laundry. Small table clothes, cloth off of the ice box.

I called Beavers Laundry near 8:15 AM.

Our bundle of laundry weighed $16\frac{1}{2}$ lbs. A lady came after it. The flowered Alford gowns were "Hibiscus" (?)


