Feb. 6. 1955-

Dear Julia:-

I arrived home Thursday and found your sweet birthday card, also the letter you spoke about awaiting me, thanks for remembering me.

I had a wonderful birthday with my children, Hazel, gave me a lovely navy blue sheer dress, her oldest daughter gave me a pretty hat to go with it, another gave me a beautiful rose pie, the one in Calif. sent me a box of lovely Hallmark cards. Rudolph, gave me two pairs of shoes and six pairs of nylon hose, her son

and family in Corpus, sent me a book  
and their little girls picture.

So many cards and gifts from friends  
all made me so humble.

I was away six weeks, the girls did  
not want me to come home, but I felt  
I must, things here at the house are  
some better, Mrs S. is up and does  
around some, but she can't think,  
sits and stares into space most of the  
time - I found a lot of my mail she  
didn't forward to me, said she forgot.

Rudolph. is going to Tampico, Mexico, on  
Feb. 18<sup>th</sup> to settle up her business down  
there, its a sad trip for her, because  
she will have to go through Alvar's papers  
and dispose of most of them in some way

She has cut her hair, and she looks  
ten years younger, said she couldn't  
go abroad with all that long hair, it  
would take too much time fixing it.

She and Goldie, are still working on  
passage for some time before the mid-  
dle of June, I hope they get off.

I had a note from Hallie Story, thanking  
me for the Christmas card, she didn't  
tell me about her mother, sister Ella,  
didn't have much mind when I saw  
her several years ago. Oh! why do  
we have to go through so much before  
we pass on?

I turned a child again while I was  
away, I rolled off the bed, hit my right  
shoulder on the gas jet and almost

broke it, I still suffer with it, can't wear the straps to my under wear over my shoulder. I also hit my head against the stove, and took all the skin off my knee. I'm use to a hard bed, and the bed was an inner spring mattress, I was too close to the edge, so when I turned over, I just went out on the floor. I had to laugh, even though I was hurt.

I went out to see my hermit sisters, they are pitiful, they do nothing but think how bad they feel, and get on each others nerves. They don't go anywhere so no one visits them often, so there they sit.

At last we have had a good rain it was slow and soaked in. we had over five inches in two days, its

still cloudy and we may have more,  
I have so many letters of thanks to  
write and with my sore arm its hard  
to do - I cleaned my room yesterday  
and got all my things in place  
so its awful here today -

This rambling letter has grown  
rather lengthy so I'd better stop  
and let you rest.

Monday Night

Dear Julia:-

We have been frozen up for the past two days, I'm sure you folk have much colder weather, however, we had a right good rain on Sat., before the norther struck.

I went to the funeral of a good friend this after noon, I had on so many clothes I could hardly walk, our cemetery is on a hill, and its cold up there, especially when the wind is high. I believe I told you that the father of one of Hazel's son in laws, was sick, well the poor man has been dying since last Sat. morn, has been in a coma, under an oxygen tent its so hard

on his wife and son, just to sit and watch him lugger - the son came from Calif. where he had gone to sail for Japan, for three years. They gave him a ten days leave, his time is up tomorrow, and they won't extend it. He is the only child and he hates to leave his mother, when his dad, is dying.

When he passes I'll go over for the funeral, and be there a few days. Rudolph, left Sat. for Tampico, to settle up the remains of Alvie, business. I hated to see her have to go, and go through his papers again, but she has so much will power, she can take it in a Christian way alone.

Clayton Malone and his wife, came by Thurs. and visited with us for awhile, they were on their way to Dallas to visit their daughter that's in Hockaday school there.

Clayton, grows more like brother Willie, all the time, he still has that sweet smile, he was always my favorite of the two boys.

Beebie, hasn't been at all well lately, her hand have been swollen so badly she couldn't bend her fingers. Of course sister Alma, is grunting too. Thank you for the nice words you said about me in your last letter. I do try to smile, be pleasant, and make people happy around me, no one

Care about my pains and aches so why  
tell them, when I began to feel sorry for  
myself, I got down and pray and I  
soon got over it. dont ever think I  
dont have plenty of pain, with my back,  
hip, leg and shoulder, but I wont let  
it get me down.

Things here at the house are not any  
better, I dont know how its going to turn  
out. Mrs Stocker, has lost all interest in  
every thing, she waits for the ones in  
the house to do for her, and I dont think  
her daughter cares, she wants her to die, she  
dont want the responsibility of caring  
for her.

I wrote Hallie Malone story a long letter  
I told her I thought she did right to put  
her mother in a place where they could  
watch her, it was too hard on her to do it.

I wonder if sister Ella, has any thing  
to take care of her, or if the children  
have to do it.

I pray every day that I wont out live  
what little I have, I dont want to be a burden  
to my children ever-

I hope Campbell, has a nice trip to Mexico.  
This letter is growing lengthy, so I'd  
better say good night.

Dear Julia:-

Your interesting letter was received a few days ago, I'm answering now so you will hear from me one more time before this year ends. I'm going to San Antonio, for the holidays, will leave on the 21<sup>st</sup>, so I'll be busy these few days before then. I won't return until some time in Jan.

Today is the first time I have been out since Tues. before Thanksgiving, I have had a bad case of nettle rash, nothing seemed to do me any good, I still scratch like a mangy dog full of fleas.

I was invited out Thanksgiving, I could <sup>not</sup> hold my head up, had temperature of 101 all day, my friend wanted to send my dinner, I said no I couldn't eat it - it was from the crown of my head to the soles of my feet.

Have you heard that sister Ella passed away the Saturday <sup>after</sup> Thanksgiving, we saw it in the paper, I wrote to Hallie, she answered, she said her mother had a hemorrhage of the brain on Mon. and lasted until Sat. - she said her six boys were the pall bearers, and the service was sweet.

Rector Malone, her son lives in Calif. His wife died with cancer in Oct. after her funeral, he flew to Iowa - and spent

ten days with them, she was so glad he came while his mother knew him, he didn't come back to her funeral. She was 90 years old.

Poor Cousin Janie Garrett, passed away Sun. morn. she was 102 yrs and 6 mos. old, it was such a blessing, she had been ill bed five years, hadn't known her own children for two years. she was buried in the Pitts cemetery in Stringtown. I was too sick to attend - it was a terrible day, raining and cold. I hope the Lord will be better to me than to let me live that long.

Hazel, left yesterday for Montgomery Ala. to be with one of her daughters, who is expecting a baby any day now - she won't return until about the 2<sup>nd</sup> of Dec. Beebie, and Alma, are both looking better, Beebie, will 86 yrs. old Wed. its remarkable how she gets around and does things.

I'm glad Campbell, has a home and is doing so well, hope he stays there and is happy.

I don't remember whether I wrote you that Glenna Malone's husband Mr Thaxton, passed away in Nov. with cancer, that's what she died with two years ago - our family is dwindling down fast.

Just one of Aunt Becki's family Cousin Sidney Cauchon and we three sister are all the children born and raised in Stringtown, that's now living - and I'm the youngest 79 in Jan. I still miss brother Wilkes, letter he always wrote me before Christmas, he wrote good letters, his sons always remember us girls with a check for Christmas, brother had them promise him to do this before he passed away.

God, bless and keep you through the coming year is my pray - With much love to you and yours this Yuletide

I have a nice cool little apt. I have a living room, small kitchen and bed room, and a very good size bath; it's all I need to keep. I'm very happy with it, I really don't have as much to do here as I did where I was, and paid board too.

My children came and moved me, they brought me a lot of my things they had, besides dishes, glasses and cook vessels, they gave me every thing I need. Jay & Hazel had a phone put in and the bill goes to them each month. Jay filled my cupboard with all kinds of can goods. R. brought every thing she had in her before she left, so we had very little to buy so far.

I'm happy I can have my friends in and don't feel cramped, also my children feel free to come more often now.

Rudolph left Fri. night by plane for Washington and New York.

She sails June 15<sup>th</sup> at high noon  
for Europe, Foldine, will meet  
her there and sail too. Foldine,  
will leave Europe Aug 11<sup>th</sup> but R-  
will remain until the last  
of Sept. They go over on the Queen  
Elizabeth, but R- will fly back.  
I think its wonderful that Claudia  
won the Fellowship to study a  
broad, I hope she goes it will  
be a grand experience for her.  
I know you are all proud of  
her.

It surely was nice in Virginia,  
to fix your bath room new.  
What would we do without our  
children?

Sister Alma, was feeling so bad  
Lillian, came over and took  
her to San Antonio, for awhile.  
Beebie, phoned me yesterday  
that she had a letter from her,  
and she said she was feeling  
worse than when she left.  
I don't know what's the matter  
with her, she seems to have  
given up.

Beebie, spent the day with me  
Thurs. She is enjoying doing  
what she pleases and cooking  
things she wants and how she  
wants them, I hope Lillian,  
keeps her mother a long time.

The government sent Hazel to Washington in May, for a two weeks school, pertaining to her work, she said it kept her busy but she enjoyed the trip, she returned last week.

She had never been to Washington before, she went to church one Sun. and sat across the aisle from the President. On the week ends she went sight seeing

Last week end R.R. (Rison) and family came to see me and brought their new son Paul Riston, for me to see, he is a darling baby

as well as good looking smiles all the time he is 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  months old. they live in Corpus, they came up to tell Rudolph good bye, they took her car to Corpus, to keep while she is away.

I hope this rambling letter reaches you. I think I've bout covered every thing. With lots of love to your dear self and family -

I'm still in S.M. poor Mr Hugo, is still dying, soon be four weeks, they keep him under an oxygen tent is all that keeps him breathing. He is full of bed sores and the odor is terrible. The air force wouldn't give Vane, any more extensions, so he has already gone to Tokoyd. I feel so sorry for his mother - as well as his family.

Last night A.R. (Rison) called me

from Corpus, that their baby had arrived and it was a boy and they named him Paul Huston Howard.

I'm so glad its over and everyone is alright, Virginia had such a terrible time when the little girl was born.

Rudolph, will arrive tomorrow night from Mexico, and she will stay until Va. comes home from the hospital.

Alva Garrett Luder, Cousin Jamie's youngest daughter died last week and was brought to the Pitts cemetery in Stringtown for burial, she was 76 years old. Poor old cousin Jamie is breathing, but not alive, has no

mind - she will be 102 in May - we wonder why she is left. She doesn't know her own children.

We are having a revival at our church this week, I get up and go to the 7 a.m. services every morning - enjoy them better than the night service, it only lasts thirty minutes.

Beebeis hands are no swollen now, its funny how they do - Alma, is still enjoying poor health.

Neither one would go to Alva's funeral and it was a beautiful day - said they couldn't hear any thing.
