LOCATION OF THE TEXAS TECHNOLOGICAL COLLEGE.

Hon. S. B. Cowell, Chairman Board of Control, Hon. F. H. Bralley, Fresident Gollege of Industrial Arts, Hon. W. S. Sutton, President University of Texas, Hon. W. B. Bizzell, President Texas A. M. M. Gollege, Hon. S. H. N. Marrs, Supt., of Public Instruction, Locating Committee for Texas Technological College. Gentlemen: mental Brief for the location of the Technological College for the purpose of submitting an additional reason for its selection as such location, such additional reason being designated as 12. In addition to the offer of the desirable site heretofore referred to, it offers additional attractive inducements and conveniences for acceptance by this Board when the location has been made in accordance with the provisions of the Act creating the college, as follows, to-wit: (a) To have deeded to the college, free of encumbrances, what is known as the Boulevare Ranch in the Palo Duro Canyon, known as Section 11, Block No. 6, Leun Ry. 60, Grantee, Randall Courty, Texas, for park and recreation purposes, and to have the same stocked free of charge with animals native to this section of the country, arrangements for which have already been made, to-wit: buffalo, antelope and black-tailed deer. This tract of land is located 10 miles south of Amarillo, in the most picturesque part of the Palo Duro Canyon. the college, two dermitories, one for boys and one for girls, as per blue print thereof hereto attached, the estimated cost of each of said dormitories being approximately \$50,000.00. is made to provide all furniture house in Amarillo, offer coverings necessary for said two domatories at actual factory cost, plus dragage, freight and expense of placing same in building. This offer has been made by Green Bros. Company, by letter to the Board of City Development of date August 2nd, the original of which is on file with the secretary of such board. (d) Through the City Light & Water Company, offer is made to furnish without charge for a period of 18 months after the occupancy of the buildings by the college, all electric current used for lighting and small power purposes, being meant the equipment using not more than 4000 watts per machine per hour. This offer contained in letter from the general manager of said company of date August 2, 1923, on file with the secretary of the Board of City Development.


(e) Amarillo pledges itself that as soon as said school has been established, to initiate and carry forward a tempaign for the creation of a student's loan fund for the purpose of assisting deserving students at the Technological College, the amount of such fund to be reasonably adequate to meet the demands made thereon.


