FIFTY-SECOND DAY
(Friday, March 29, 1974)

The Convention met at 9:30 o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment and was called to order by the President.

The roll was called and the following were recorded present: 159 Present, 13 Absent-excused, 8 Absent. (Record 1, Appendix)

The Reverend Dr. McGary Ford, Pastor, First Baptist Church, Jacinto City, offered the invocation.

LEAVES OF ABSENCE

Delegate Bales was granted leave of absence for today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Coleman.

Delegate Blanchard was granted leave of absence for today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Hightower.

Delegate Howard was granted leave of absence for today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Craddick.

Delegate Mattox was granted leave of absence for today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Coleman.

Delegate Semos was granted leave of absence for today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Cates.

Delegate Lombardino was granted leave of absence for today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Madla.

Delegate Heatly was granted leave of absence for today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Nabers.

Delegate Tarbox was granted leave of absence for today on account of compassionate reasons on motion of Delegate Short.

ARTICLE IX ON SECOND READING

The President laid before the Convention Article IX as unfinished business.

Question: Shall Article IX be adopted?

Delegate Hendricks offered the following amendment to Article IX, Section 3:

Amend Article IX, Section 3(c) to read as follows:

(c) County attorneys, district attorneys, and criminal district attorneys are elected in such numbers and for such counties as now or hereafter provided by law. They shall represent the state in criminal cases in the county and district courts and perform other duties as provided by law.

The amendment was read and was adopted by a non-record vote.

Delegate Baker offered the following amendment to Article IX, Section 3:

Amend Article IX, Section 3(d) to read as follows:

(d) The county commission shall provide for the election of a constable to serve each justice court established under authority of Article V, Section 7 (b) of this Constitution. Each constable is elected for a four-year term by the qualified voters of the county, precinct, or precincts in which the justice of the peace served by the constable is elected.

The amendment was read.

Delegate Kaster moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table was lost by the following vote: 54 Yeas, 96 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 29 Not Voting. (Record 2, Appendix)

Question recurring on the adoption of the amendment, shall the amendment be adopted?

DELEGATES PRESENT

Delegates Hernandez, Hudson, Lary, Allred and Wyatt who had previously been recorded as "Absent" were announced "Present".

Amend Article IX, Section 3(d) by changing the word "may" to "shall".

The motion to table was lost by the following vote: 67 Yeas, 90 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 22 Not Voting. (Record 3, Appendix)

Question recurring on the adoption of the amendment by Delegate Geiger, shall the amendment be adopted?

The amendment was adopted by the following vote: 84 Yeas, 71 Nays, 2 Present-Not Voting, 23 Not Voting. (Record 4, Appendix)

The amendment as amended was then adopted by a non-record vote.

Delegate Nabers offered the following amendment to Article IX, Section 3:

Amend Article IX, Section 3(f) by striking the sentence beginning "in the case of" and ending with the word "commissioners" on line 2, page 3.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 86 Yeas, 60 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 33 Not Voting. (Record 5, Appendix)

Delegate Boone explained Section 4(a) of Article IX.

(Delegate Calhoun in Chair)

Delegate Murray explained Section 4(b) of Article IX.

Delegate Mengden explained Section 4(c) of Article IX.

(President in Chair)

Delegate Patman offered the following amendment to Article IX, Section 4:

Amend Section 4(a) by adding prior to the word "majority" these words: "two-thirds".

The amendment was read.

Delegate Traeger moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by a non-record vote.

Delegate Hanna explained Section 5 of Article IX.

Delegate Washington offered the following amendment to Article IX, Section 5:

Amend Article IX, Section 5, as follows: Strike "600" and substitute "1,500".

The amendment was read.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Delegate Clower offered the following substitute for the amendment to Article IX, Section 5:

Amend Article IX, Section 5 by striking the number "600" on line 2 and substituting therefor the number "5,000".

The substitute for the amendment was read.

Delegate Hanna moved to table the substitute for the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 90 Yeas, 57 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 32 Not Voting. (Record 6, Appendix)

Delegate Spurlock offered the following substitute for the amendment to Article IX, Section 5:

Amend Article IX, Section 5, as follows: In Section 5, strike "600" and substitute "3,500".

The substitute for the amendment was read.

Delegate Washington moved to table the

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 78 Yeas, 69 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 32 Not Voting. (Record 7, Appendix)

Question recurring on the amendment by Delegate Washington, shall the amendment be adopted?

The amendment was then adopted by a non-record vote.

Delegate Traeger explained Section 6 of Article IX.

Delegate Traeger offered the following amendment to Article IX, Section 6:

Amend Article IX, Section 6, as follows:
In Section 6, strike "600" wherever it appears and substitute "1,500".

The amendment was read and was adopted by a non-record vote.

Delegate Creighton explained Section 7(a)(b) of Article IX.

(Delegate Bock in Chair)

DELEGATE PRESENT

Delegate Gammage who had previously been recorded as "Absent" was announced "Present".

(President in Chair)

Delegate Allen of Harris explained Section 7(c) of Article IX.

Delegate Evans explained Section 7(d) and (e) of Article IX.

Delegate Washington offered the following amendment to Article IX, Section 7:

Amend Article IX, Section 7, Subsection (b) to read as follows:

(b) Counties, cities, and towns may provide for special districts and authorities within their boundaries but only if authorized by general law. No local law may create a special district or authority wholly within a county, city, or town if a general law authorizes the county, city, or town to create a special district or authority for the same purpose.

The amendment was read and was adopted by a non-record vote.

Delegate Schwartz offered the following amendment to Article IX, Section 7:

Amend Article IX, Section 7, by adding a new sentence at the end of Section 7(d) as follows:

No bill which would require the notice provided for herein may, by its terms, eliminate the necessity of such notice or in any way alter the general law notice requirements in existence at the time of the introduction of such bill.

The amendment was read and was adopted by a non-record vote.

Delegate Washington explained Section 8 of Article IX.

Delegate Nabers offered the following amendment to Article IX, Section 8:

Amend Article IX, Section 8 by striking all of Section 8 and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

Section 8. Terms of Office. The terms of office for elected county officials provided for in Article IX shall be for 4 years. All other elected officials shall be as provided by law or charter.

Delegate Hutchison explained Section 10 of Article IX.

(President in Chair)

Delegate Washington offered the following amendment to Article IX, Section 10:

Amend Article IX, Section 10, Subsection (h) to read as follows:

(h) Ad valorem taxes levied by special

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districts and authorities, school districts and junior and community college districts shall not be counted as part of the ad valorem tax limits imposed on counties, cities, and towns by this section.

The amendment was read.

On motion of Delegate Washington and by unanimous consent, the amendment was withdrawn.

Delegate Caldwell offered the following amendment to Article IX, Section 10:

Amend Article IX by striking Section 10.

The amendment was read.

Question: Shall the amendment be adopted?
