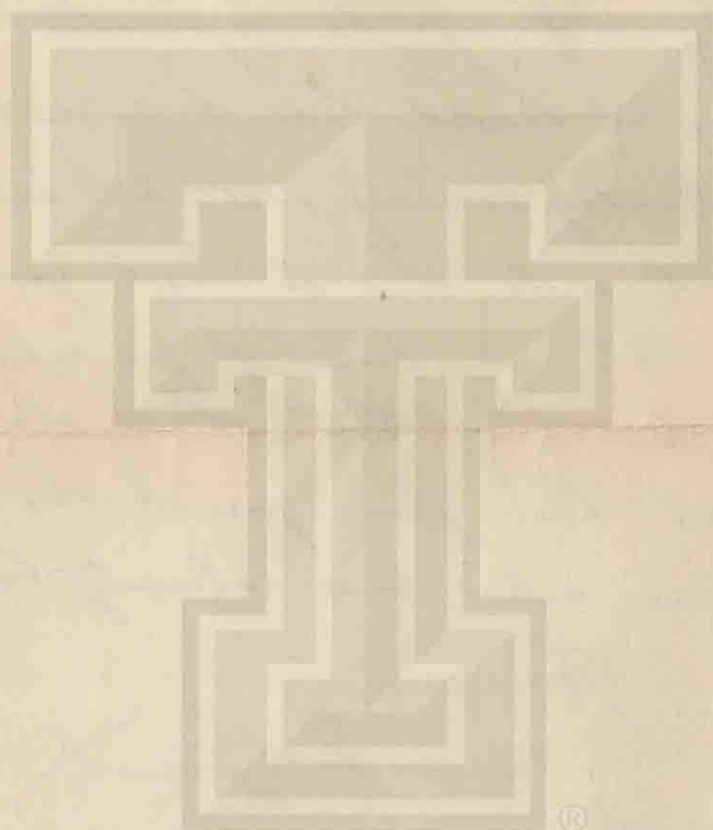
Dear Miss Trued.

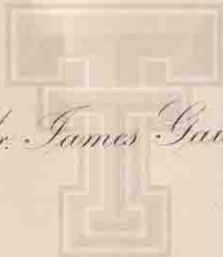
I suppose
