AFTER RECESS

The Convention met at 9:30 o'clock a.m., pursuant to recess, and was called to order by the President.

The roll was called and the following were recorded present: 157 Present, 3 Absent-excused, 20 Absent. (Record 1, Appendix)

Dr. Rachel Henderlite, Professor Emerita, Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary, Austin, Texas, offered the invocation as follows:

All people of the earth are yours, O God, and you love them. The world is yours, for you made it.

You have given each one of us a little spot to live on, to care for--neighbors to watch out for, a family to love. You have given us jobs to do, and the strength to do them.

To these men and women here in this Constitutional Convention you have given a mighty job. Give them mighty hearts, O God. Give them mighty insight. Remind them hourly that what they do here is done not only for themselves but for each individual in the state. Remind them that you are the lawgiver, and that justice is yours. Amen.

I move that we suspend all necessary rules in order to invite Governor Edwin Edwards, Governor of the State of Louisiana, to address the Texas Constitutional Convention on Tuesday, May 21, 1974.

By unanimous consent Rule 1, Section 12 was suspended and the Motion in Writing was adopted.

Delegate Denson offered the following amendment to Section 5 of Article V:

Amend Article V, Section 5 by eliminating Section 5 in its entirety and renumber the following sections accordingly.

The amendment was read.

(Delegate Grant in Chair)

Delegate Hale moved to table the amendment.

(President in Chair)

Delegate Wilson was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Calhoun.

Delegate Schieffer was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Olson.

Delegate Lombardino was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Madla.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 108 Yeas, 38 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 33 Not Voting. (Record 2, Appendix)

Delegate Washington offered the following amendment to Section 5 of Article V:

Amend Section 5, Article V, to read as follows:

Section 5. CIRCUIT COURTS. (a) The legislature shall establish in each judicial district, now or hereafter provided by law, a circuit court with one or more judges. A circuit court may serve one or more counties, but no county shall have more than one circuit court.

(b) A county in which a circuit court serving only the one county has more than one

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Judge shall be divided by the county commission into single judge districts for the election of judges to the circuit court. Within the calendar year following that in which each federal decennial census is published and at such other times as the county commission deems necessary, the county commission shall redivide the county into districts for the election of circuit court judges. The districts shall be composed of contiguous territory and shall be as compact and nearly equal in population as practicable.

The amendment was read.

DELEGATES PRESENT

Delegates Vecchio and Doyle who had previously been recorded as "Absent" were announced "Present".

Delegate McDonald of Hidalgo moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 89 Yeas, 55 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 35 Not Voting. (Record 3, Appendix)

(Delegate Bynum in Chair)

Delegate Baker explained Section 6 of Article V.

DELEGATE PRESENT

Delegate Harris of Dallas who had previously been recorded as "Absent" was announced "Present".

Delegate Bales offered the following amendment to Section 6 of Article V:

Amend Article V by striking Section 6 in its entirety and renumbering subsequent sections accordingly.

The amendment was read.

(President in Chair)

Delegate Baker moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 132 Yeas, 8 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 39 Not Voting. (Record 4, Appendix)

Delegate Spurlock explained Section 7 of Article V.

Delegate Denson offered the following amendment to Section 7 of Article V:

Amend Article V, Section 7, Subsection (b), to read as follows:

(b) The county commission in each county may establish and maintain one or more justice courts in the county with each court

to exercise jurisdiction in one or more precincts in the manner provided by law.

The amendment was read.

On motion of Delegate Denson and by unanimous consent the amendment was withdrawn.

Delegate Denson offered the following amendment to Section 7 of Article V:

Amend Article V, Section 7, Subsection (a), to read as follows:

(a) The county commission in each county may divide the county from time to time into justice precincts.

The amendment was read.

DELEGATES PRESENT

Delegate Schieffer who had previously been recorded as "Absent-excused" was announced "Present".

Delegate Cates who had previously been recorded as "Absent" was announced "Present".

Delegate Spurlock moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 126 Yeas, 18 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 35 Not Voting. (Record 5, Appendix)

Delegate Denson offered the following amendment to Section 7 of Article V:

Amend Article V, Section 7, Subsection (b), to read as follows:

(b) The county commission in each county may establish and maintain one or more justice courts in the county with each court to exercise jurisdiction in one or more precincts in the manner provided by law.

Amend Section 7 of Article V, (b) to read as follows:

The governing body in each county of less than 15,000 population may, and those with 15,000 population or over shall establish and maintain one or more justice courts in such county with each such court to exercise jurisdiction in one or more precincts in the manner provided by law.

The amendment was read.

Delegate Spurlock moved to table the amendment.

DELEGATE PRESENT

Delegate Hall of Harris who had previously been recorded as "Absent" was announced "Present".

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 122 Yeas, 32 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 25 Not Voting. (Record 7, Appendix)

Delegate Cooke explained Section 8 of Article V.

Delegate Ogg explained Section 9 of Article V.

DELEGATES PRESENT

Delegate Sullivant who had previously been recorded as "Absent-excused" was announced "Present".

Delegate Head who had previously been recorded as "Absent" was announced "Present".

The President laid before the Convention Judiciary Committee Minority Report Number 3:

BE IT PROPOSED,

That the following be substituted for Article V, Section 9(a) of the majority proposal:

ARTICLE V THE JUDICIARY

Sec. 9(a). The legislature shall divide the state into judicial election districts equal in number to the number of justices on the supreme court. Each district must be composed of compact and contiguous territory and contain as nearly as practicable an equal number of inhabitants. One justice of the supreme court is elected every six years by the qualified voters of each judicial election district. The Chief Justice of Texas is elected every six years by the qualified voters of the state.

Delegate Ogg moved to table the Minority Report.

The motion to table was lost by the following vote: 58 Yeas, 87 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 34 Not Voting. (Record 8, Appendix)

Question: Shall the Minority Report be

Delegate Doran moved the Convention take recess until 2:00 o'clock p.m. today. The motion prevailed by the following vote: 90 Yeas, 57 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 32 Not Voting. (Record 9, Appendix)

Accordingly the Convention at 12:08 o'clock p.m. took recess until 2:00 o'clock p.m. today.

AFTER RECESS

The Convention met at 2:00 o'clock p.m., pursuant to recess, and was called to order by the President.

ARTICLE V ON SECOND READING

The President laid before the Convention as unfinished business Article V with Minority Report Number 3 pending.

Question: Shall the Minority Report be adopted?

DELEGATES PRESENT

Delegates Hudson, Snelson, Wolff and Evans who had previously been recorded as "Absent" were announced "Present".

Delegate Wilson who had previously been recorded as "Absent-excused" was announced "Present".

(Delegate Newton in Chair)

LEAVES OF ABSENCE

Delegate Clayton was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of official state business on motion of Delegate Hoestenbach.

Delegate Williamson was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Calhoun.

Delegate McKnight was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Moore.

Delegate Dramberger was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Traeger.

(President in Chair)

The Minority Report failed of adoption by the following vote: 62 Yeas, 91 Nays, 2 Present-Not Voting, 25 Not Voting. (Record 10, Appendix)

PAIRED VOTE

Delegate Hollowell (present), who would vote "Yea", with Delegate McKnight (absent), who would vote "Nay".

Delegate Weddington offered the

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following amendment to Section 9 of Article V:

Amend Section 9(b) of Article V by striking the word "four" and substituting the word "six".

The amendment was read.

Delegate Ogg moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 100 Yeas, 47 Nays, 3 Present-Not Voting, 30 Not Voting. (Record 11, Appendix)

Delegate Kaster offered the following amendment to Section 9 of Article V:

Amend Article V, Section 9(e) to read as follows:

(e) Municipal judges are selected in the manner provided by law or by charter as authorized by law.

The amendment was read.

Delegate Ogg moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table was lost by a non-record vote.

Question recurring on the adoption of the amendment.

The amendment was adopted by a non-record vote.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Delegate Calhoun was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Bailey.

Delegate Tarbox offered the following amendment to Section 9 of Article V:

Amend Article V, Section 9, Subsection (e), to read as follows:

(e) The municipal court judge of a city or town may be elected by the qualified voters of the city or town. Assistant municipal court judges shall be appointed by the municipal court judge with the approval of the governing body of the city or town. Vacancies in the office of municipal court judge shall be filled by the governing body for the remainder of the term.

The amendment was read.

Delegate Ogg moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table was lost by a non-record vote.

Question recurring on the adoption of the amendment, shall the amendment be adopted?

On motion of Delegate Tarbox and by

unanimous consent, the amendment was withdrawn.

Delegate Simmons offered the following amendment to Section 9 of Article V:

Amend Article V, Section 9 by adding a new subsection (f)

(f) No person, appointed by the governor and confirmed by the Senate shall be allowed to succeed himself to the position to which he was appointed at the next general election.

The amendment was read.

Delegate Ogg moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 97 Yeas, 47 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 35 Not Voting. (Record 12, Appendix)

Delegate Tarbox offered the following amendment to Section 9 of Article V:

Amend Article V, Section 9, Subsection (e), to read as follows:

(e) The municipal court judge of a city or town shall be elected by the qualified voters of the city or town as provided by law. Assistant municipal court judges may be appointed by the municipal court judge with the approval of the governing body of the city or town. Vacancies in the office of municipal court judge shall be filled by the governing body for the remainder of the term.

The amendment was read.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Delegate Kubiak was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Olson.

Delegate Ogg moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 76 Yeas, 62 Nays, 2 Present-Not Voting, 40 Not Voting. (Record 13, Appendix)

Delegate Nowlin offered the following amendment to Section 9 of Article V:

Amend Article V, Section 9 by deleting all of said section and substituting the following:

Section 9. Election of Judges. (a) The Chief Justice and justices of the Supreme Court shall be elected by the qualified voters of this State every six years on a nonpartisan ballot in the manner provided by law. Judges of the courts of appeals shall be elected by the qualified voters of their respective districts every six years on a nonpartisan ballot in the manner provided by law.

(b) Vacancies in the offices of justices and judges of the Supreme Court and the Courts of Appeals shall be filled until the next succeeding election by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate.

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(c) District and Circuit court judges shall be elected on a nonpartisan ballot by the qualified voters as provided by law. Judges of the district and circuit courts shall serve four year terms. Vacancies in the office of district and circuit courts shall be filled until the next succeeding general election by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate.

(d) Justices of the peace shall be elected by the qualified voters of the county or precinct every four years in the manner provided by law. Vacancies in the office of justice of the peace shall be filled by the county commission until the next succeeding general election.

(e) Municipal judges shall be selected in the manner provided by law.

The amendment was read.

(Delegate Nabers in Chair)

Delegate Ogg moved to table the amendment.

(President in Chair)

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 94 Yeas, 48 Nays, 2 Present-Not Voting, 36 Not Voting. (Record 14, Appendix)

Delegate Mauzy explained Section 10 of Article V.

Delegate Hendricks offered the following amendment to Section 10 of Article V:

Amend Article V, Section 10(c) to read as follows:

(c) Any justice of the Supreme Court, judge or justice of the peace may be removed, suspended or censured as provided by law.

The amendment was read and was adopted by a non-record vote.

Delegate Hale explained Section 11 of Article V.

Question: Shall Article V as amended be adopted?

Each district must be composed of compact and contiguous territory and contain as nearly as practicable an equal number of inhabitants. One justice of the supreme court is elected every six years by the qualified voters of each judicial election district. The Chief Justice of Texas is elected every six years by the qualified voters of the state.

(c) District and Circuit court judges shall be elected on a nonpartisan ballot by the qualified voters as provided by law. Judges of the district and circuit courts shall serve four year terms. Vacancies in the office of district and circuit courts shall be filled until the next succeeding general election by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate.

(d) Justices of the peace shall be elected by the qualified voters of the county or precinct every four years in the manner provided by law. Vacancies in the office of justice of the peace shall be filled by the county commission until the next succeeding general election.

(e) Municipal judges shall be selected in the manner provided by law.
