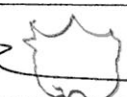

A message was received in this city Monday morning telling of the death of Mr. O. White, a former citizen of this county, which occurred at the Soldiers Home near Kansas City the preceding night.

Mr. White spent several weeks of the early winter in this city, returning to the Home about the middle of December. He was feeling unwell during the last week of his stay here.

The eighty-first milestone of life was passed Nov. 21, 1922. A little more than four years of his life was spent in service in the Union Army.

Mr. White was for a number of years one of the county's most progressive farmers. He was a man of bright, cheerful disposition and was held in the highest esteem and confidence by all who knew him.

He was a devoted member of the Christian church.

The remains were brought to this city Wednesday afternoon and were laid to rest in the McDowell cemetery west of Belton this afternoon at 2:30 o'clock. The funeral services were conducted by Rev. Chas. Barker.

Mr. White is survived by two sons, John White of Bland and James White of this city, and a daughter, Miss Margaret White of Galveston. He was also a devoted father to a step-son and two step-daughters, Newton Evans and Mrs. E. A. Miller of this city and Miss Elvora Evans White of Galveston. He was also survived by eleven grand-children and eight step-grand-children with a large number of friends throughout the country.

James White and sister, Miss Margaret, were with their father during his last days.

SOWS FED BALANCED RATION

Kansas Reports 71 Per Cent More Pigs Raised Than Those Receiving Mostly Corn.

Sows put on balanced rations raised 71 per cent more pigs than those receiving the same management but fed on low protein rations in a "Save the Pig" campaign carried on by extension workers in Kansas last spring. Farrowing records were kept by 53 farmers. According to a report received by the United States Department of Agriculture, 263 sows on 29 farms received corn and a protein supplement of either tankage, skim milk, alfalfa, or linseed oil meal. These 263 sows farrowed 2,669 pigs, an average of 10 to a litter, of these pigs 1,713 were weaned, an average of 6.5 pigs per litter. On 11 farms 166 sows received mostly corn rations, farrowing 1,194 pigs, an average of 7 to the litter, of these pigs 1,045 were weaned, an average of 3.8 pigs to a litter.

CONTROL CURCULIO BY SPRAY

Good Progress Made in Georgia in Overcoming Infestation—Big Peach Crop Produced.

One of the best peach crops ever produced in Georgia has just been harvested. It is reported to the United States Department of Agriculture.
