FIFTY-FIRST DAY
(Thursday, March 28, 1974)

The Convention met at 10:10 o'clock a.m. pursuant to adjournment, and was called to order by the President.

The roll was called and the following were recorded present: 167 Present, 4 Absent-excused, 9 Absent. (Record 1, Appendix)

LEAVES OF ABSENCE

Delegate Schwartz was granted leave of absence for today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Adams of Jasper.

Delegate Coleman was granted leave of absence for today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Pentony.

Delegate Newton was granted leave of absence for today on account of illness on motion of Delegate Calhoun.

Delegate Parker of Denton was granted leave of absence for today on account of illness in family on motion of Delegate Hendricks.

DELEGATES PRESENT

Delegates Hernandez and Whitehead who had previously been recorded as "Absent" were announced "Present".

COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE
CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION RESOLUTION 12

The President laid before the Convention the following Resolution:

C.S.C.C.R. 12, Providing for rate of payment for Delegate Grant riding his horse from Marshall to Austin for Convention.

The resolution was read and adopted by the following vote: 160 Yeas, 1 Nay, 2 Present-Not Voting, 17 Not Voting. (Record 2, Appendix)

PRESENTATION TO DELEGATE GRANT

Delegate Atwell on behalf of the Convention presented to Delegate Grant a certificate and hat.

MOTION TO TAKE RECESS
FROM APRIL 5 TO MAY 6

Delegate Adams of Jasper moved that the

Convention take recess from 5:00 o'clock p.m. on April 5, 1974, until 1:00 o'clock p.m. on May 6, 1974.

DELEGATES PRESENT

Delegates Parker of Denton and Schwartz who had previously been recorded as "Absent-excused" were announced "Present".

Delegate Jones of El Paso who had previously been recorded as "Absent" was announced "Present".

Delegate Hale moved to table the motion.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 144 Yeas, 25 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 10 Not Voting. (Record 3, Appendix)

DELEGATE PRESENT

Delegate Canales who had previously been recorded as "Absent" was announced "Present".

CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION RESOLUTION 28

The President laid before the Convention the following resolution:

C.C.R. 28, Proposing the Convention's duration be extended 60 days beyond May 31, 1974.

Delegate Adams of Jasper offered the following amendment to C.C.R. 28:

Amend C.C.R. 28 by substituting the following for the resolving clause thereof:
RESOLVED that the Constitutional Convention of 1974 be, and the life thereof be and it is, hereby extended to June 14, 1974, until 11:59 p.m.

The amendment was read.

LEAVES OF ABSENCE

Delegate Head was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Temple.

Delegate Wyatt was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Bynum.

Delegate Murray moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 138 Yeas, 30 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 11 Not Voting. (Record 4, Appendix)

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Delegate Hernandez was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Miller.

Question recurring on the adoption of the resolution, shall the resolution be adopted?

March 28, 1974

The resolution was adopted by the following vote: 123 Yeas, 47 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 9 Not Voting. (Record 5, Appendix)

On motion of Delegate Murray and by unanimous consent, the vote by which the resolution was adopted was reconsidered and tabled.

CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION RESOLUTION 26

The President laid before the Convention the following resolution:

C.C.R. 26, Proposing the Constitutional Convention take recess until May 6, 1974.

(Delegate Finney in Chair)

Delegate Hale offered the following amendment to C.C.R. 26:

Amend the Resolving Clause of C.C.R. 26 to read as follows:

Resolved, that it is the sense of the Convention, that the Convention should be in recess either upon completion of the Articles now on the calendar awaiting consideration on second reading or at the close of business on April 5, whichever occurs first, until 2:00 p.m., Monday, May 6, 1974, unless earlier convened by the President upon the written recommendation of a majority of the delegates.

The amendment was read.

(President in Chair)

Question: Shall the amendment be adopted?

RECESS

On motion of Delegate Hightower the Convention at 12:01 o'clock p.m. took recess until 1:30 o'clock p.m. today.

AFTER RECESS

The President called the Convention to order at 1:30 o'clock p.m., pursuant to recess.

CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION RESOLUTION 26 ON SECOND READING

The President laid before the Convention as unfinished business C.C.R. 26 with an amendment by Delegate Hale pending.

Question: Shall the amendment be adopted?

DELEGATES PRESENT

Delegates Lee and Donaldson who had previously been recorded as "Absent" were announced "Present".

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Delegate Lombardino was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account

of important business on motion of Delegate Madla.

Delegate Murray offered the following amendment to the amendment to C.C.R. 26.

Amend the amendment to C.C.R. 26 by striking out the date April 5 of the resolving clause and insert in lieu thereof the date March 30.

The amendment to the amendment was read.

LEAVES OF ABSENCE

Delegate Schwartz was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Adams of Jasper.

Delegate Wolff was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate Traeger.

Delegate Hale moved to table the amendment to the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 107 Yeas, 47 Nays, 2 Present-Not Voting, 24 Not Voting. (Record 6, Appendix)

DELEGATE PRESENT

Delegate Coleman who had previously been recorded as "Absent-excused" was announced "Present".

Delegate Shelson offered the following amendment to the amendment to C.C.R. 26.

Amend the amendment by striking the words and figure "May 6" and insert "May 13".

The amendment was read.

Delegate Williamson offered the following amendment to the amendment to the amendment to C.C.R. 26:

Amend the amendment to C.C.R. 26 by deleting the date of "May 6" and in its place add "June 3".

Delegate Shelson moved to table the amendment by Delegate Williamson.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 142 Yeas, 17 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 20 Not Voting. (Record 7, Appendix)

Question recurring on the adoption of the amendment by Delegate Shelson, shall the amendment be adopted?

The amendment failed of adoption by the following vote: 77 Yeas, 84 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 18 Not Voting. (Record 8, Appendix)

Delegate Poff offered the following amendment to the amendment to C.C.R. 26:

Amend the amendment by inserting the words "Local Government" before the word

"Articles" and strike the "s" on the word "Articles" and the words "now on the calendar awaiting consideration on second reading".

The amendment to the amendment was read.

Delegate Hale moved to table the amendment to the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 101 Yeas, 63 Nays, 16 Not Voting. (Record 9, Appendix)

Question recurring on the adoption of the amendment by Delegate Hale, shall the amendment be adopted?

The amendment was adopted by the following vote: 97 Yeas, 65 Nays, 1 Present-Not Voting, 17 Not Voting. (Record 10, Appendix)

Question recurring on the adoption of C.C.R. 26 as amended, shall C.C.R. 26 as amended be adopted?

Delegate Mengden offered the following amendment to C.C.R. 26:

Amend C.C.R. 26 to read as follows:

WHEREAS, The Constitutional Convention of Texas has attempted to complete its work by April 7, but consideration of articles on second reading is progressing more slowly than expected; and

WHEREAS, There is no longer any realistic possibility that the work of the Convention can be finished by early April; and

WHEREAS, Some of the delegates are involved in contests for nomination to public office, to be determined in the primary elections on May 4, and during the month of April their attention can be expected to be diverted somewhat from full-time participation and debate on the important issues facing the Convention; and

WHEREAS, Conscientious consideration of constitutional revision is of immense importance to the people of Texas, and the costs of unnecessary delay are great; and therefore be it

RESOLVED by the Constitutional Convention of Texas, That this Convention be and is hereby declared to be in recess from the close of business each Thursday until 1:30 p.m. each Tuesday, for the period beginning on April 4, 1974, and ending on May 14.

MENGDEN
BLYTHE

The amendment was read.

Delegate Hale moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by the following vote: 107 Yeas, 57 Nays, 2 Present-Not Voting, 14 Not Voting. (Record 11, Appendix)

PAIRED VOTE

Delegate Adams of Jasper (present), who would vote "Nay", with Delegate Schwartz (absent), who would vote "Yea".

Question recurring on the adoption of C.C.R. 26 as amended, shall C.C.R. 26 be adopted?

The resolution was adopted by the following vote: 99 Yeas, 69 Nays, 12 Not Voting. (Record 12, Appendix)

On motion of Delegate Hale and by unanimous consent, the vote by which C.C.R. 26 was adopted was reconsidered and tabled.

ARTICLE IX ON SECOND READING

The President laid before the Convention on its second reading Article IX (full report having been printed on March 22).

On motion of Delegate Hale, and by unanimous consent, Article IX will be considered section by section.

Delegate Washington explained the full report on Article IX.

Delegate Short explained Section 1 of Article IX.

Delegate Bynum offered the following amendment to Article IX, Section 1:

Amend Article IX, Section 1 (c), Local Government Committee Report, as follows:

In Section 1, Subsection (c) strike "two-thirds".

The amendment was read.

Delegate Boone moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by a non-record vote.

Delegate Bynum offered the following amendment to Article IX, Section 1:

Amend Article IX, Section 1 (b), as follows:

Between "boundaries" and "are", insert "and the merger of counties".

Strike "merger or counties or the".

The amendment was read.

Delegate Short moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by a non-record vote.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Delegate Lary was granted leave of absence for the remainder of today on account of important business on motion of Delegate McDonald of Hidalgo.

DELEGATE PRESENT

Delegate Cobb who had previously been recorded as "Absent" was announced "Present".

March 28, 1974

Delegate Martin explained Section 2 of Article IX.

Delegate Finney offered the following amendment to Article IX, Section 2:

Amend Article IX, Section 2 to read as follows:

Section 2. POWERS OF COUNTY GOVERNMENT. The powers of counties are those granted by this constitution and by law.

The amendment was read.

Delegate Martin moved to table the amendment.

The motion to table prevailed by a non-record vote.

Delegate Russell explained Section 3 (a) of Article IX.

Delegate Kaster explained Subsections (b) through (g) of Section 3 of Article IX.

(Delegate Maloney in Chair)

Delegate Grant offered the following amendment to Article IX, Sec. 3 (a):

Amend Article IX, Section 3 (a) by striking the last sentence.

The amendment was read.

(President in Chair)

On motion of Delegate Grant and by unanimous consent the amendment was withdrawn.

Delegate Hendricks offered the following amendment to Section 3 (a), Article IX:

Amend Subsection (a), Section 3, Article IX, to read as follows:

Sec. 3. COUNTY AND DISTRICT OFFICERS. (a) The governing body of each county is the county commission, consisting of a county judge elected by the qualified voters of the county and four county commissioners, each elected by the qualified voters of separate and compact precincts containing as nearly as practicable an equal number of inhabitants. The county judge is the presiding officer of the county commission. The county judge shall perform such judicial duties and functions as may be now or hereafter provided by law.

The amendment was read and was adopted by a non-record vote.

Delegate Hale offered the following amendment to Section 3 (b), Article IX:

Amend Article IX, Section 3 (b) to read as follows:

(b) The qualified voters of each county elect a sheriff, treasurer, tax assessor-collector, and county clerk. The legislature may provide by law for the election of a single clerk to perform duties of both a county clerk and a district clerk.

The amendment was read.

On motion of Delegate Hale and by unanimous consent the amendment was withdrawn.

Delegate Hendricks offered the following amendment to Section 3(c) of Article IX:

Amend Subsection (c), Section 3, Article IX, to read as follows:

(c) County attorneys, district attorneys and criminal district attorneys are elected in such numbers and for such counties as now or hereafter provided by law. They shall represent the state in all criminal cases in the county and district courts and perform other duties as provided by law.

The amendment was read.

On motion of Delegate Hendricks and by unanimous consent the amendment was withdrawn.

UNANIMOUS CONSENT TO RECORD VOTE

The following delegates requested unanimous consent to be recorded as voting on the following record votes. There was no objection:

Delegate Brooks requested to be recorded as voting "Yea" on Record Votes 6, 7 and 10.

Delegate Hudson requested to be recorded as voting "Yea" on Record Vote 11.

Delegate Vale requested to be recorded as voting "Nay" on Record Vote 6.

Delegate Weddington requested to be recorded as voting "Yea" on Record Vote 6.
