SIXTY-THIRD DAY (Monday, May 13, 1974)

AFTER RECESS

The Convention met at 2:00 o'clock p.m., pursuant to recess, and was called to order by the President.

The roll was called and the following were recorded present: 149 Present, 10 Absent-excused, 21 Absent. (Record 1, Appendix)

Dr. Rachel Henderlite, Professor Emerita of Christian Education, Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary offered the invocation as follows:

You are the Ruler of the universe, O God. You have made it and you are the Governor of it. And it is good. We would praise you and give you thanks.

Grant to these men and women to whom you have entrusted the government of this small portion of the earth enough of your wisdom, enough of your grace, that they may govern wisely and graciously. Let them never forget that they are working in these halls in your name and for the sake of all the people who live here in the cities, the counties, the small towns of this state, all the people whom you love. Amen.

Section 1. JUDICIAL POWER. The judicial power of the state is vested in a judicial system composed of a Supreme Court of Civil Appeals, a Supreme Court of Criminal Appeals, Courts of Criminal Appeals, District Courts and Circuit Courts. All courts shall have jurisdiction as provided by law, but jurisdiction of courts of the same level must be uniform throughout the state.

The amendment was read.

Delegate Earle explained Section 2 of Article V.

Delegate Coleman explained Section 3 of Article V.

DELEGATES PRESENT

Delegates Ogg and Washington who had previously been recorded as "Absent" were announced "Present".

The President laid before the Convention Judiciary Committee Minority Report Number 2.

By unanimous consent the Minority Report was withdrawn.

Delegate Earle offered the following amendment to Section 3 of Article V:

Amend Section 3 of Article V to read as follows:

Sec. 3. COURTS OF APPEALS. There shall be one or more courts of appeals as provided by law, each consisting of a chief judge and

at least two other judges. No fewer than three judges may sit in any case, with a majority thereof necessary to a decision. Cases not assigned to a section shall require a majority of the court for a decision.

The amendment was read.

On motion of Delegate Earle and by unanimous consent the amendment was withdrawn.

Delegate Creighton offered the following amendment to Section 3 of Article V:

Amend Sec. 3, Article V, The Judiciary, to read as follows:
Sec. 3. COURT OF APPEALS. There shall be one or more courts of appeals as provided

by law, each consisting of a chief judge and at least two other judges.

The amendment was read and was adopted.

Delegate Jones of Harris explained Section 4 of Article V_{\star}

Delegate Washington offered the following amendment to Section 4 of Article v:

Amend Section 4, Article V, to read as follows:

Sec. 4. DISTRICT COURTS. (a) The state shall be divided into judicial districts as now or hereafter provided by law. In each judicial district there shall be one district court with one district judge.

(b) A county in which there is more than one judicial district composed only of the one county shall be divided by the county commission into single judge districts for the election of judges to the district courts, which courts shall have countywide jurisdiction. Within the calendar year following that in which each federal decennial census is published and at such other times as the county commission deems necessary, the county commission shall redivide the county into districts for the election of district judges. The districts shall be composed of contiguous territory and shall be as compact and nearly equal in population as practicable.

The amendment was read.

SIXTY-THIRD DAY (Monday, May 13, 1974)

AFTER RECESS

The Convention met at 2:00 o'clock p.m., pursuant to recess, and was called to order by the President.

The roll was called and the following were recorded present: 149 Present, 10 Absent-excused, 21 Absent. (Record 1, Appendix)

Dr. Rachel Henderlite, Professor Emerita of Christian Education, Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary offered the invocation as follows:

at least two other judges. No fewer than three judges may sit in any case, with a majority thereof necessary to a decision. Cases not assigned to a section shall require a majority of the court for a decision.

The amendment was read.

On motion of Delegate Earle and by unanimous consent the amendment was withdrawn.

Delegate Creighton offered the following amendment to Section 3 of Article V:

Amend Sec. 3, Article V, The Judiciary, to read as follows:
Sec. 3. COURT OF APPEALS. There shall be one or more courts of appeals as provided

by law, each consisting of a chief judge and at least two other judges.

The amendment was read and was adopted.

Delegate Jones of Harris explained Section 4 of Article V_{\star}

Amend Section 4, Article V, to read as follows:

Sec. 4. DISTRICT COURTS. (a) The state shall be divided into judicial districts as now or hereafter provided by law. In each judicial district there shall be one district court with one district judge.

(b) A county in which there is more than one judicial district composed only of the one county shall be divided by the county commission into single judge districts for the election of judges to the district courts, which courts shall have countywide jurisdiction. Within the calendar year following that in which each federal decennial census is published and at such other times as the county commission deems necessary, the county commission shall redivide the county into districts for the election of district judges. The districts shall be composed of contiguous territory and shall be as compact and nearly equal in population as practicable.
