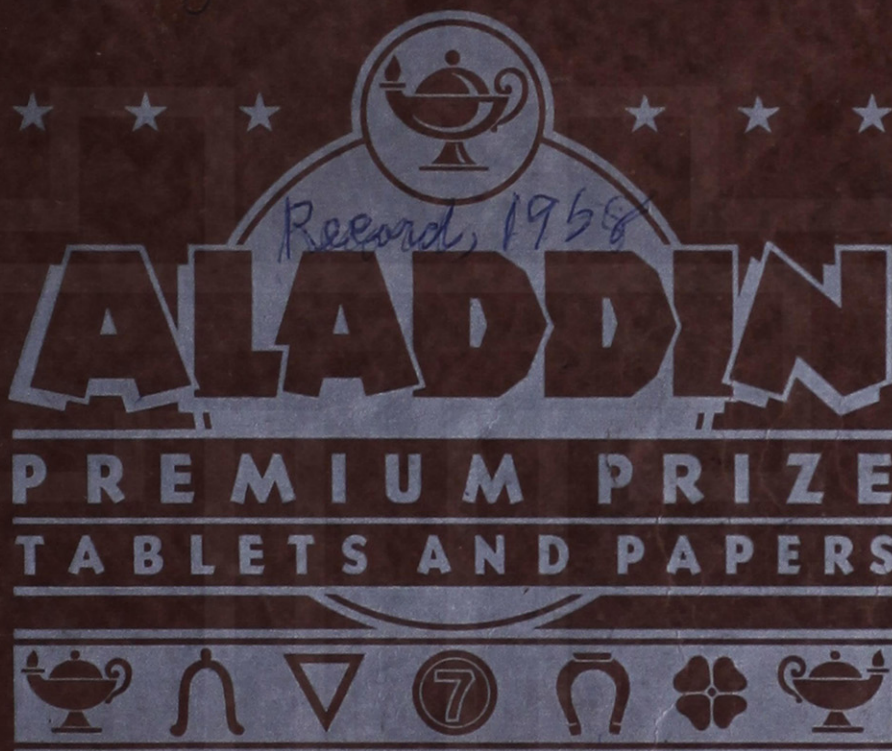
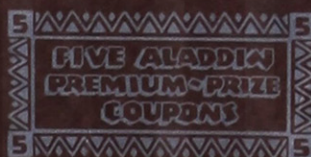

Heard 6:15 and 7 AM news and 80. Clock news.
I picked up more "stuff" to help burn
pile at back. Kate Cobb visited us.

2. Clear, M. 27°. Thru b. & dishes by 6:15 AM.

● Heard news. Alice washed. I hung
them out. Thru all at 9:25 AM.
I burned "Can" trash & stuff at back.

3. Clear, M. 31°. Through breakfast and dishes by 6:35.
Called Beal about taking me out to
get Mineral Water. To go Sat. A.M.

I taxied to Dr. Yeager's Office & then from
Piggly W.'s home. Never saw Dr. Yeager.

4. Cloudy, M. 3°. Thru b. & dishes near 7:15 AM.

Beal took me out to our old place to
get 7 gal. of mineral water.

I drove out to our old tank.

It was full. The one on the point
not full. The water looked blue.

Home by 11 A.M. (I got stamps & postals
at P.O.) Alice lay down after dinner.

I picked up an arm full of cement sacks.

10. I pruned persimmon. Painted Eats.
Carried 5 gal. Cam Charcoal out to burn.
Alice finished apron. Talked to Freda.
I went to Red Barn.

11. Clear. M. 34°. Through b. & dishes by 6:35 A.M.

Edwin and Joel came to work on
moving the Cemetery fence S. 20 ft.
Got all the holes dug. Got iron pipe
corner post dug up & the two gate
post dug up. Got all moved & set
in rock and cement. Pat sawed a
big dead tree down. I piled all small
limbs & burned them. Ed & Joel & Alfred
& David & Ferrill & Dean all came into
town to eat at a Cafe. Brought me
home for dinner. I went back with
them. Ed & Joel brought me home (5:15)
To try to move the fence out next Sat.
L.A. came in the afternoon. He mixed cement.

18 Clear. M. 32°. Iron b. & dishes before
6:15. Heard news. Cloudy. Same cooler.

Ed & Joel came. We went with them
to pick up Beal. Stopped by Mamie's
to leave Alice there. Jim & Mamie
was there. Ed, Joel & I went onto the
Cemetery. Pat, Bell & Emmerson
came. Alfred & David E. came.

Got the fence wire loose & moved
out. I painted all the iron fence
stays. They were spaced in side
the fence & drove down ^(with a sledge). Alfred
wired them to the fence (clouted up).
Pat sawed up the old tree with
Emmerson's circle saw. Wood to go
for Emmerson & Bell to burn.

Had dinner in back of Emmerson's pick
up. Tim, Macie's boy & Lawrence came.
Tim brought us home. (2:30 P.M.)

I got up near 1:10. Alice still asleep at 1:30.
Got up at 2:10.

22 I called Oxford Moore about st. light being out on S E 2nd St. & 13th ave.

Galusha left out at 7:40 a.m.

I went to seedlr. Yeager. Said my face spot was doing O.K. To come back in 2 wks. or 17 days. Rev. Hamilton brought me home. (3 P.M.). mailed letter to Orlean & May R.

(Bill at Piggly Wiggly \$3.84.) (1 chicken)

23. Cloudy. M. 40°. Thru b. & dishes by 6:30.

I ans. Mabelle Robinson's letter.

also ans. Lilla Locke's letter.

I talked to Agora Hay. I went to Red Barn. Then called Bertha Swink & Perry Davis. Kate Evb came. I went with her down to Mrs. Whitley's where Alice was. Bud looked over the Commode tank.

24. Clear. M. 29°. I got all fires lit & my face washed & the table set before 6 a.m. Thru b. & dishes by 7 A.M.

I called Oxford about the mud by Mrs. Whitley's.

Oxford came near 8:30 to see about it.

Alice ironing. Thru before 9:30 a.m.

Trash man went by. Nettie came P.M.

Brought old papers. I brought me a mimosa tree. I put it out East of house.

25. Cloudy. M. 41°. Thru b. & dishes by 6:45.

Alice called Ella Mae (Mitchell) our neighbor.

I dug more bermuda grass away from the mimosa tree. Put some sand around it. Put more water on it.

Cont'd. January, 1958.

25 Bought $\frac{1}{2}$ doz eggs from Mr. Turpin.
I dug some grass from the dog with a
butcher knife. I washed my feet.

Alice took a bath. 8 o'clock.

26 Clear, M. 33°. No wind. Thru b. & dishes by 7 A.M.
Heard 7 o'clock news on WBAP.

(Mr. & Mrs. E. L. Roberson came Sat. eve.)

We both went with Bro. Wade & Brinda.
Alice's class had 12 present, my class 10.

At 1:15 the M. 70°. We got home as the
clock was striking 12 o'clock. (\$250,000,000)

Mary Alice came for Alice to go see
Barbara's & husband's shower gifts.

I heard Billy Graham from Santa Riche.
Caribbean Sea. Beverly Shay sang.

I went with Bro. Wade Johnston & Brinda
to meeting at 5:30 & T.V. at 6:30 and then
preaching service. Bro. Pendly baptised
Brinda & a Mrs.

27 Cloudy, M. 40°. Waked up early.

Got up at 5 A.M. Thru breakfast before

Jason Earl came over. Bro. Dry called.
Showered. We read 1 John 3:14-24.

29. Cloudy. M. 40°. Lit fires at 6 A.M.

Threw b. & dishes at 6:30. Shook rugs.

Alice dry mopped all floors. 7:50 A.M.

Turned over feather bed to air.

Put all covers out on line to sun.

I taxied to Baker Hotel & tailed from Pig home.
(10 A.M.). Gro. bill \$6.15. (Mailman at 10:45)

I heat water in wash pot. scalded
old bed spread & scalded some grass.

I went with Wade & family to service ^{some} ^{5:45}

30. Clear. M. 34°. Up after 6 A.M. Heard news.

Threw b. & dishes before 7:15 A.M.

Put water on to heat to wash.

Threw washing by 9 A.M. Thung out.

old iron pipe fence. Used a sledge.
Alice making apple preserves & jelly (5 apples).

31. Clear. ^{January, 1958} M 50°. Thru h. & dishes by 4:30.
Alice ironing. I turned water on.
Alice thru ironing at 8:10 A.M.
Heard 8 a.m. news. Promised rain.
Called Miller's trading post.
Alice sewed the last strip on her
quilt top. Heard Fat Stock Show
auction off their champion fat steer
for \$6,000. It came from Apline, offered
by a Miss Kay Holland. (Last day of Jan.)
Alice talked to the (2) nannies. Both O.K.

February, 1958.

1. Clear. M. 32°. No wind Thru h. & dishes 4:30.
I went to Red Barn. Lady's Name ^(Louise) ~~argumanes~~
Alice had swept & mopped all floors.
I "butchered" more bunch yard grass.
Mr. and Mrs. Hinson came near 4:30 P.M.
New Index boy collected (name Allen Denny)
Pd. up to March first, 1958.
2. Clear. M. 30°. No wind Thru h. & dishes 6:40.
I shaved & took a bath. Alice washed her feet.
& took a bath. We both went to S.S. and
Church. Home by 12 O'clock.
I went with Bro. Wade to deacon's meeting
at 5 P.M. Came back home with Wade.
Went back with him. Home by 5:45 P.M.
3. Clear. M. 30°. Up by 5:30 A.M. Thru h. and
dishes by 6 O'clock. Heard 6:15 news.
Mrs. Whitley came. I mowed grass outside.
I shaved. Heard Noon, news & Lock Ruhlman.

cont'd. February, 1958. 670 acre farm.

3 Pulled grass by our East line of brick. We rested. I shaved. Put on clean underwear. Called Bro. Dixon Turner about going with him to Grafard to the workers conference. To leave near 4:30. Alice still piecing quilt blocks. I went with Bro. Turner & Bro. Steward to workers conference at Grafard. Home by 9:45 P.M.

4 Cloudy. M. 48°. Thru b. & dishes by 7 A.M. I cut a few small bunches of grass and weeds in garden & in bed by Persimmon. Alice started tacking out a Log Cabin pattern quilt. (9 A.M.) Heard Helma Doss. I used the "scratcher" around all rose cuttings. Also scratched around Paradise trees and blooming willow & red honeysuckle. Thru dinner before 12 O'clock noon. Alice tacked more. I hoed next south fence outside Clear to Mr. Teague's S.W. corner. Thru by 2:30.

Lawrence, Mary Alice & I don came. Mary was hunting the names of the Blocker family etc. Had some of the names typed.

5 Cloudy. M. 63°. Thru breakfast & dishes at 7 A.M. Thru washing by 9 A.M. Clouds heavy in west. Showered. I taxi'd to Pig W. Mrs. Kilson brought me home. (Groceries \$3.37.) (11:05) 7

cont'd. February, 1958.

5. We both rested. I watered everything. Alice gathered in the dried clothes.

Got our Readers Digest. I had gotten up my questions for Sunday in T.V. I washed my feet. ^(a girl, Donna Langborn, from Mrs. & Mrs. Bentley at 4:46 PM)

6. Cloudy. M. 44°. Thru b. & dishes before 7 A.M.

Alice ironing. Wind N.W. To be colder. I answered Maggie (Watson) Taylor's letter (11:20 A.M.) Thru dinner by 12:15.

We lay down a while. Benfy used tel.

7. Clear. M. 30°. Wind N.W. or north

I lit fires. Thru b. & dishes at 7 A.M.

I wrote a card to Edwin.

I called Dr. Yeager. Told him about the scab on the spot near my left eye.

Told him how it dropped off. He said O.K.

Promised to see him if it starts to come back.

I went to the Red Barn. Got us

2 hamburgers ^{55¢} with Irish sp. Alice talked to Corda.

I nailed a short 2x6 at bottom of north gate.

Put 4 more buckets of road gravel at back.

Mowed some in yard - grass too short.

Got a Hay Case, went right back, Corda came to get indexes.

8. Clear. M. 26°. Thick ice on Can. Thru b. & dishes at 7:40.

I burned all trash at the back.

Cut a few bunches of grass outside (S).

Alice working on bow-tie quilt top. I shaved.

We both lay down - up at near 3:14 ^{8 PM}.

February, 1958.

9. Cloudy, M. 38°. Our street light was out. Through breakfast & dishes at 6:30 A.M. We both went with Mrs. Wade and family to S.S. and Church. Home by 12:15. Misted more. Then dinner by 12:30.

● M. 37° at 1 P.M. Alice lay down. I did not. Looked over my gnestones for T.V. This is my new pen Orleans sent me. Also sent me a pair of socks. Sent Alice some jewelry. And my fountain pen. 10 Cloudy, M. 34°. Walk wet. Misty. I heard clock strike 5 A.M. up at 5:30. Alice up after 6 A.M. Then b. & dishes 7 A.M. Turned on the water. M. 31° at 9:30 A.M.

11. Cloudy, M. 30° at 7:30 A.M.

Thru b. & dishes by 7 A.M. Got up after 6 A.M. Heard 6:15 news. Turned water on. Mailed letter I had written to Ellen & Bela. Alice wrote a card to a Mrs. Tucker, and Ans. Aggie's letter.

12. Clearing, M. 24°. Snow covering the ground. Thru b. & dishes by 7 A.M. clock.

● I taxied to Service Drug & home from Piggly Wiggly (10:30). (Got my ^{1.25} med., Alice's med. at ^{1.85} Service Drug) Thurman & Freda came. Left at near 9 P.M. We ate supper.

13. Clear, M. 18°. Thru b. & dishes at 6:40 A.M. Alice broke ice on can to put on water to wash some. (7 A.M.) Heard Bride Lines.

cont'd. February, 1958.

13 Alice hung clothes in back bed room and by ironing board in wall.

Turned on water near noon.

Mr. & Mrs. Hinson came. Then Mr. Turpin. Ray Daniels married Mrs. Hinson's nephew, Mr. Penay. Alice sewing together Kaki etc. to use to pad a quilt. Mrs. Ely called.

Gave me part 4 in T.V. Alice talked to her. 14. Droun fog day. Cloudy. M. 38°. No wind. Done breakfast and dishes before 7 A.M.

most of clothes dry. Heard 7 A.M. news. 14 Went to Red Barn. (Opened at 11:30 A.M.) 6 apples³⁸, bananas⁵⁰, frozen beef liver³⁰ 1.18. The beef liver was in frozen slabs. Rained a little. Over 1/2 a tub full by 2 P.M. Alice lay down.

Mrs. Kelly called. I finished peeling the 6 apples. Weighed 1 apple (1 lb.).

15. Clear. M. 24°. Done B. and dishes by 7 A.M.

Turned water back on after 9 A.M.

Milk man (Capt. McBarren) came at 9:40.

I talked to Mr. Bass, Dist. Rep. manager.

Alice called Mr. Knudder. Mrs. R. had gone to town.

Done supper at 5:30 P.M. Alta Ray came.

Alice got my clean union suits and

clean shirt & Kaki & for socks. I took a bath.

Alice called Mrs. Bowen.

16. Clear. M. 20°. Bath up after 5:30. Done B. and

dishes at 6:30 A.M. I shaved at 8:30 A.M.

We both went to services. Home by 12:10 P.M.

Contd. February, 1958.

16. Thru dinner by 1 P.M. Alice rested.
So did I. I heard Billy Graham from
Central America. (3 P.M.).

I went to night services with Wade &
Brindy. Home near 8:45; Alice in bed.

17. Cloudy. M. 24°. No high wind.

I got up at 6:15. Heard news.

Thru breakfast and dishes near 7 O'clock.

I began writing out ^{my} Bible questions
for T.V. Got questions written out for
Sun. Feb. 23 and Sun. Mar. 2.

Edwin & Carrie came. She to make a
talk at Co. wide teachers meeting.

Edwin at supper, stayed & talked
with us. They left at 10 P.M.

18. Cloudy. M. 31°. Breakfast at 6:35 A.M.

Thru b. & dishes by 7 O'clock. Heard news.

Went to Red Barn near 11 A.M. (Opened)

We both lay down after dinner.

Jimmy brought the fruit ^{8:50} asked for (3 P.M.).

19. Cloudy. M. 31°. Breakfast at 7. I shaved.

Mrs. & Mrs. Hinson brought me my book.

"Teaching Adults in the Sunday School."

I & they took me to town (N. of Baker)

& brought me home from Piggly Wiggles.

(at 10 A.M.) \$4.77 pd. P. Wiggle.

I read 2 chapters in the book.

I never went to prayer meeting.

Bro. Hinson & Bro. Charlie S. never went.

February, 1958.

20. Cloudy. M. 31°. Up after 5 A.M.
Threw b. and dishes by 6:15 A.M.
Alice got a bundle of clothes ready
to send out for a dry wash.
Washing some herself to hang in-
side to dry. (7:45). Hung'em outside.
I watered all yard things with rain water.
Bob Huddleston came after the big
steer horn he had loaned me. (1:15 P.M.)
His daughter drove him over. We were
both laying down. Still Cloudy.
I went down to see Mrs. Whitley's
new (pink) room. But trying to
start a lawn mower.

Alice still sewing on an apron.
Minor Gizzard brought Macie
to see us. Came by Lee Blocker's.
Alta Fay used tel. ~~to see us~~

21. Cloudy. M. 46°. We ate breakfast near
7 A.M. Got a letter from Ida & Lee.
I answered it. David Haggard
came to get 2 quilt tops Alice had
for her. She ate ^{& helped wash} dinner with us.
Alice napped. I never lay down.
Showered at 2:30 P.M. very light.
Alta Fay came.

22. Cloudy. Raining very light. (1 tub full).
Alice sick in night. Had to sit up
a while. But slept later. Took a bath.

Contd. Feb. 1958.

22 No mail to day. George Washington's birth day. Also Geo. Locke's. Alice lay down after 9:15. never got to mail letter I wrote to Ida & Lee Locke at Center Point.

23. Clouds south, mostly clear north. M. 42°. Flood reported 3 in. rain near Corpus Christi & W. of Austin. Thon b. & dishes by 7 AM. Heard news. I got ready before 8:30 A.M. for church services. Alice not feeling well enough to try to go to services.

I got home a few minutes before 12 noon. Alice soon had dinner ready. Judy & husband, Roy Philips, came for a few minutes. Sun out. I went with Wade to night services (met 1st with Fannita Sullivan for a planning meeting).

24. Clear. M. 42°. Heard 6:15 news.

Flood in S. Texas. Last wk. rains.

Glennia brought May Ripley to see us. Took her home before 12 O'clock.

We both rested. Up before 2 P.M.

Fannita hung out her clothes.

I hoed weeds & grass out of garden & okra plot at back. Cut a lot of bunch grass & weeds in yard with the butcher knife.

February, 1958.

25. Clear. M. 45°. Thru b. & dishes by
ten minutes of 7 A.M. Heard guide lines.
("I'll dig a ditch so straight and true,
That God himself can look it thru.")

I finished laying off the garden—
(10 rows). (2) onions, (2) I. peas, (2) Pinto,
(2) creams, 1 lettuce, 4 Melba (outside).
Mrs. Pilgrim brought Alice her Avon
order, an Antiseptic. Bud brought
my saw home. I took Bud a copy
of Feb. Readers Digest.

Alice started another quilt top.
(very small blocks). I sold Leo Miller
the junk I had piled up for \$1.00.
