Dear Mother,

We got the pictures back that we took on the picnic.

They were all taken with my Kodak, and are really good. I am sending you the negatives to have them done at Maurer's. I think they do them cheaper than they do at Foxes. I did not think you would mind.

for me, please. The whole  
bunch paid for the films  
& Ruth Roby had them de-  
veloped so I'll only have to  
pay for my print. Please  
take them as soon as you  
go, or get Bernice to maybe,  
for there are still lots more  
who want to get <sup>the</sup> <sup>negatives</sup> these.

I tell you what to do  
give them to Enaivers & tell  
them to mail them to me.  
then I'll send my set to you  
so you can see them. Then  
you won't have to pay postage  
on them I don't think.

We made some candy  
yesterday. Katie's room mate  
& teacher the one Murry furnished  
the sugar & chocolate & I the  
milk. We borrowed an iron  
turned it up side down and  
let her cook. Dora made it  
It was awfully good.

I went out to a mission

in Cotton Miss district last night. Mr. Boone who does the preaching came by and took several of the college girls in his car. We walked back.

Last night Dora had her friend Lucille Bates to stay all night with us. Dora had the collie caramels cake and ah! it was good.

Mother I'm hungry. Today we had potatoes, spinach, and meat. I ate no meat, and had no potatoes for they gave out before they got to me. So I had two green onions, three radishes, two pieces (tiny) of corn bread with a bit of butter & a spoonful of greens. I was hungry before I left the table and stayed to see if the girls would bring some more corn bread, but she didn't. We always have corn bread for dinner but never do we have butter. We have butter for supper and breakfast.

Mother did I tell you how much we enjoyed the nuts? We borrowed a cracker

that cracked them whole & ate  
marshmallows with them. The  
marshmallows were left from  
the picnic.

We keep flowers in our  
room all the time now and  
it seems so nice.

I must stop and study  
but will write you soon

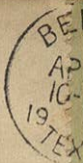
