

Houston Jan. 15, 1919

Dear Ruth:- Just writing a note
to tell you I leave on the ^{Soelbeck} Inter-ur-
ban for Galveston, It rained all

OF PIECE given as follows (B), Two Sleeve (E), Standing Co and Sleeve-cap ir lar (H), Belt Gore (K), Back TO CUT.—Pla by triple "TTT" fold, except belt, wise fold and re large "O" perf thread of mater TO MAKE.—I notches. Close close shoulder s front and back, Join standing c Face lining s of small "o" Close seams as between notche edge between de in lining armh front. Close under- notched, close lower edges of "TT" perforati and front edge. Center-front o large "O" per centers and un edges together Join skirt s to the left of "O" perforation in front gore for open on double "oo" perforations. Form perforations, bring folded edges to c perforations and press. Gather upper "TT" perforations. Sew to belt, c perforations in skirt and in belt tog Trim as illustrated or in any
