Dad had all his bundles threshed Fri & Sat were glad its is done have out over 2 bales of cotton will make 6. we are getting it all this pulling but about 2 acres of the very first we pulled. Leldon & wife Helen and a friend from Clarendon were down for a few minutes while ago. Leldon has lost weight he is on a diet still large enough. Son, I pray you are o.k. we have not heard since the letter you wrote the 3rd of Dec we are so anxious to hear from you I plan on going to be with Nola when the baby comes wies (or plan too) next Sun P.M.

Auntie Frank and Rene will stay here while
I'm gone Nola wanted Dad to come but it
hard to get your things loaded too on the
out side. We have so many hogs to feed and
10 of them are almost ready for the market
I'm still selling all the butter fat in
form of butter. But the Churn attachment
to the Mixer you gave is sure does the
work. We are getting from 3 to 4 doz eggs a
day. I am sending this letter by common mail
and another by plane hope you receive
both write when you can we surely
want to hear soon love
